



PARIS, Dec. 1 .- The United States has again been given an opportunity to have a hand in European affairs. An invitation has been sent to the American government asking the Americans to appoint members to each of the two committees which are to investigate Germany's financial condition, and pass on the German government's ability to meet the reparations payments. The request to the United States to take such part in the investigation was forwarded to the Washington government by Col. James Logan today on behalf of the reparations commission.

WASHING TON, Dec. 1. -Any announcement of the attitude of the American government toward the new invitation to aid in the reparations settlement must await the arrival in Washington of the official invitation itself.

In the meantime the powers that be in official circles do not look upon the latest move with the optimism that is apparent in some quarters abroad.

Many times within the last few weeks President Coolidge and his advisors have asserted their belief that the real solution of the European difficulties could be accomplished only by a full and unrestricted inquiry into the facts, rather than by detached investigations into the separate individual phases of the problem.






