HOUSTON, Aug. 12.—Cotton in Texas needs rain, except in a few instances, according to reports from all sections to H. H. Schultz, government statistician, here. In many places the time for rain to do much good, the reports show, is past, because it is feared the moisture will either revive the somewhat dormant insect pests or cause the plants to shed excessively.

Rain quickly, however, is the dominant note in the reports, which came from scores of farmers, ginners, bankers and business
