San Angelo Tuesday, got a same results. deputy sheriff there and went to the man's place four miles North of San Angelo on a small farm.

The still, one of the largest ever captured in this part of Texas, was different from the usual kind found. The man showed the officers how it worked and also stated that he invented it himself. It had no coils, but had a concentrator of vapors where they were separated from the boiling mash, and it is said turned out a whisky with more kick than the usual moonshine. Mesecke further stated that he had been making whisky at that place for about four months and had formerly been a bootlegger in Bell county before coming here

The vault is a brick structure with thick cork between layers of onerete. The walls and ceiling are thick cork plastered with a special elastic plaster called stone wall plaster. Miles people should be proud of this building and are especially invited to inspect it. Of special interest are he automatic doors for the purpose of unloading from the car and loading on to the trucks, as these doors snap open as a cake of ice hits them and instantly close the second it passes through.

Auto Owners Told Dangers Good Progress Being Made Lurking in Carbon Monoxide

Voicing a warning against the deadly effects of carbon monoxide gas, present in the exhaust of automobiles, the United States Bureau of Mines sets for the following general rules:

Never run automobile enwine in closed or poorly ventilated garage.




