



In the opinion of Mr. Fabis people are just now beginning to wake up to the fact that it pays to set out pecan trees from every possible side of the industrial angle. In the sandy land parts of Brown county, which are located mostly in the Northern part of this county, farmers have taken a great deal of interest in the development of the pecan industry, and setting out trees is still in progress on a large scale.

Mr. Fabis says in this part of the Southwest, Arbor Day, which is on February 2, is too late to set trees out, and in his opinion Arbor Day in Texas should be the latter part of November or first part of December. The further North, the later the date for Arbor Day, and the further South the earlier the date. He says it is really too late to set trees out after February 22nd.

In every locality in Brown county more attention is being given to the pecan industry in the way of setting out trees than at any previous time in the history of the industry in this part of the state, says Mr. Fabis, and this is one of the very encouraging signs of the times from an industrial point of view.


