HISTORY TEXAS LEGION MEETING

DALLAS, July 28 .- The largest yote in any Texas primary or general election was cast in Saturday's primary, the Texas Election Bureau said today in announcing the count thus far tab-

From 249 counties, 151 of which are complete, a total of 791,456 votes have been turned in to the bureau. The next highest vote was in August 1924, when in the primary 789,027 votes were cast.

In the count tabulated up to noon today Moody only lacked 373 of having a majority over the field in the governor's race. This is a fifty per cent gain over the Tuesday tabulation, and if he maintains this gain the final tabulation will give him a safe majority.
