Eastland County Second In Texas In Peanut Acreage

Eastland was the second county in Texas in peanut growing in 1944 according to a report from the Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce.

Comanche County, adjoining Eastland County to the south, was the state's leading peanut acreage county with 68,923 acres. Eastland County had 50,000 and Atascosa County was third with 40,588. Atascosa County is just south of San Antonio.

Comanche was the third county in the nation in peanut acreage planted and Eastland was the tenth county in the United States, the report showed.

Other leading peanut producing counties in Texas included Wilson, Erath, Frio, Hood, Wise, San Saba, Bexar, Grayson, Denton, Bee, Brown, Guadalupe, Parker, Callahan, Mason, Anderson, Gonzales, Johnson, Houston and Gillespie.

These 23 Texas counties harvested 15 per cent of the nation's peanut acreage in 1944.
