### RUNNELS COUNTY SHEEP . AND WOOL STATISTICS

The proposed tariff schedule now under consideration by Congress putting wool on the free list is of interest to the sheep growers of Runnels county. The present tariff on wool is, approximate ly, 11 cents per pound. The quantty of wool clipped in this county is not of record, but the clip per sheep per annum amounts to about five pounds.

There are 15,138 sheep and goats, valued at \$62,672 by the Federal Census Department, on the farms and ranges of Runnels county. The annual wool and mohair production is valued at \$10, 897 and 1995 sheep and goats are sold and slaughtered each year, and their value is \$8,260.

The number of these animals on he farms and ranges of the entire State is 1,808,709, which have a value of \$6,301,364. The production of sheep and goats is 591,976 annually, valued at \$1,-361,544 and the State's yearly wool production is valued at \$2. 267,308.




