Rural Carriers To Begin Card Distribution

Postmaster C. C. Gilbert announced this week that rural carriers will begin distributing Livestock Survey cards Nov. 19.

W. J. Greer, Route 1, and Odis Guy, Star Route, will leave cards with farmers and stockmen along their routes.

Patrons receiving livestock cards are requested to complete and return them to their mail box. Cards will then be returned to the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service in Austin. Information from this survey is used in estimating numbers of cattle, hogs, sheep and chickens on Texas farms and ranches.

Many farmers and ranchers are glad to take a few minutes time to answer the questions asked on livestock numbers. They have information available to help them make business decisions. Information obtained from this survey is returned to farmers and ranchers through Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service Releases, newspapers, radio and television.

This annual survey has been a joint undertaking of the Post Office and the Department of Agriculture since 1924, Mr. Gilbert said.

Dec. 1 Deadline To Register For Scout Jamboree

The fifth National Boy Scout Jamboree to be held July 22 through 28 of 1960 near Colorado Springs, Colorado, will be attended by some 53,000 Boy Scouts, Explorers and their leaders.

Choose your favorite color if you do not need to consider the color or colors of furnishings which you must keep. Select a picture or print which has your chosen colors and plan your scheme from that, if you prefer.

Good proportion of the different colors is important. This means that your color scheme will be definitely dark or light and that either warm or cool colors will predominate. Proportions of 60 percent of area for one color, 30 percent for a second color and 10 percent for accent, insure good proportion.

When you place the colors in a room, choose the color for the largest areas first — floor covering, walls and large upholstered pieces. In most cases, these should be your most livable colors, or colors that are greyed in intensity. Next, choose colors

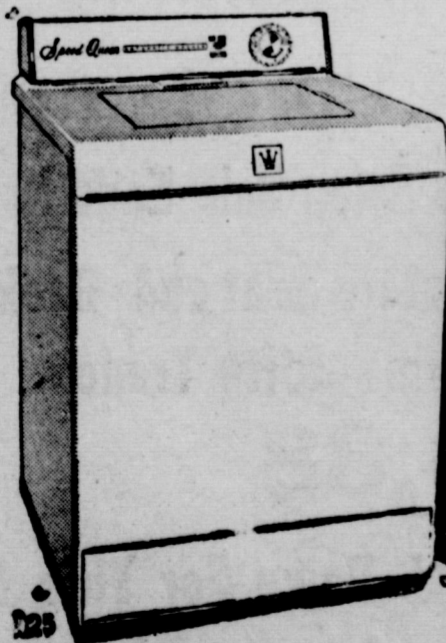

Last week at the Eastland Civic League and Garden Club, Mrs. Ed Wende from Cisco, served a delicious pumpkin pie for dessert. Since we are nearing Thanksgiving and Christmas, here is the recipe for those who might like to use it.

Pumpkin Chiffon Pie
1 cup brown sugar, 3 eggs, 1/2 cup evaporated milk, 1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spices, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1 cup cooked pumpkin, 1/4 cup cold water, 1 envelope plain gelatin, 3 tablespoons sugar.
Soak gelatin in cold water.

Cook brown sugar, egg yolks, pumpkin, milk, spices and salt over low heat until thickened. Add gelatin, stirring until dissolved. Chill in refrigerator until it begins to set. Beat egg whites until stiff, add 2 tablespoons sugar. Fold pumpkin mixture into egg whites. Fill a baked pie shell. Chill, serve with whipped cream and toasted coconut.

The Installation Of A Cleaner For Farmers Stock Peanuts

We are now able to custom clean your peanuts for you before they are graded. Peanuts which are not eligible for loan because of excess foreign material can now be made eligible by cleaning.

Here's the way it works: The peanuts are emptied into an elevator which takes them up to the cleaner. The cleaner will remove most of the sand, rocks, sticks, leaves, etc. They are sampled as they leave the cleaner. Another elevator takes them to an overhead bin which will hold them until the entire load has been cleaned.

The clean peanuts are then loaded into a truck and weighed prior to selling. Your grade and weight are determined on clean peanuts.

The cost of cleaning will be much less than the penalty for excess foreign material. It will pay you to see us before selling your peanuts.
