"It has been hard to determin hat punishment should be mete enter, in pasing sentence. "We have had many cases where viola tions of the Mann act have been unished with a fite only. W ave had other cases where de ne or two years in the peniteniary. The circumstances in thi case have been aggravating. Th ife of the defendant, by his own dmissions, has not been a moral est known men of his race an his example has been far reach ing.
"The sentence shall be that the efendant shall be confined a year and a day in the Jolict peniten-
tiary and that he shall be fined $\$ 1,000$."
