Program Completed For Pecan Field Day In Cisco May 15th

Disease and insect control and new varieties will be featured on the program at the annual Eastland County Pecan Field Day at Cisco on May 15th, according to Oscar Schaefer, Cook Community, president of the Pecan Growers Association, and R. L. Ponsler, president of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce, who are jointly sponsoring the all-day affair.

The walnut caterpillar, the worm that did so much damage to the pecan trees last year; the pecan nut case bearer and the pecan scab will be discussed and measures given for control at the morning session to be held at the Victor Hotel by Dr. Don King, Dept. of Entomology of A&M College. Also on the morning program is L. D. Romberg, U. S. Pecan Field Station, Brownwood, discussing characteristics of the Choctaw and Wichita varieties of pecans he developed there on the station after years of research.

The group will be guests of the Chamber of Commerce for lunch. The afternoon session will be held at the F. O. Hilburn orchard, 5 miles southeast of Cisco in the

Leon River bottom. A pecan grafting demonstration showing the latest techniques will be given by Romberg; a key of the nut case bearer egg and larva; a spraying demonstration and power saw demonstrations will be given. Dr. King will conduct the insect survey whereas J. W. Foster, Weatherford, will demonstrate a power sprayer and Bob Perkins, Eastland and Joe Criswell, Rising Star will demonstrate the power and chain saws.

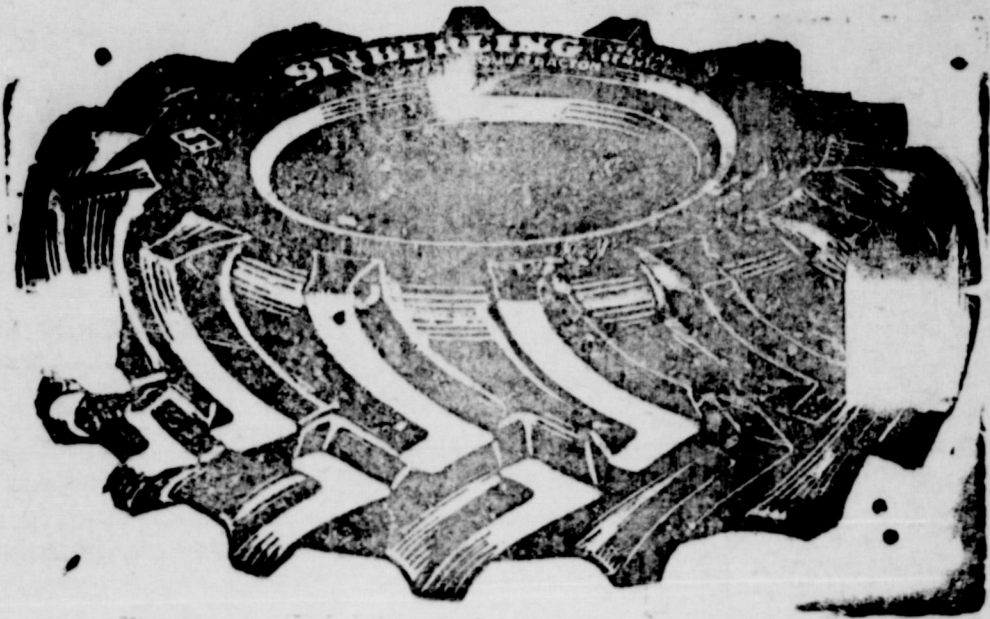

In drying fern, pick at maturity and press with a warm iron. Store between layers of newspapers from 4 to 6 weeks. Palm-etto may be treated this way, also. Sage palm dries naturally in 3 to 4 weeks. Store grasses, cones, branches, and grains (such as wheat) in a box to dry.

Many wild flowers will dye successfully. The creamy white cones will absorb hot dye (the kind used for fabrics) as soon as they are picked. Hydrangeas should be picked just after peak of the blooming period, when blossoms begin to die on the bush. Store until completely dry.

Blossoms of these flowers must be bleached before dyeing to produce bright, clear colors. Use a solution of half chlorine bleaching agent and half water; bring to a boil and remove from the heat. Place a few blossoms in the solution and stir with a fork for even bleaching. Rinse in cold water and spread on the grass, hedge or shrubbery to dry in the sun.

To gilt or tint leaves, weeds, and grasses, bronzing oil is mixed with powdered pigment, which is available at most paint and paper stores. Also available is a ruby bronze and oil mixture in gold, aluminum, rose or green. Poster paint is practical for some materials. This oil will float on top of water. Dip leaves or material down into the water and as it is brought up the gilt will stick to the leaves. Allow to drain and dry.

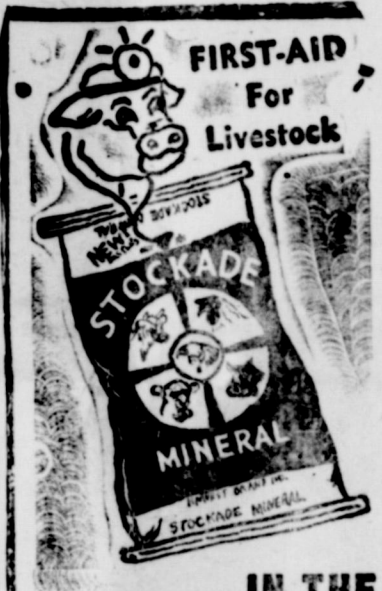


Soil Stewardship Week
