Lyndall Morrow On Track Team at HPG

Janes Lyndall Morrow, a 1958 graduate of Carbon High School and now a freshman at Howard Payne College, is doing well as a cinderman for his track team.

He entered in the Border Olympics and was in the mile relay team which won third place. He was in the Sprint Medley that took first place in the West Texas Relays at Odessa, at the Texas Relays in Austin, and at the North Texas Relays at Denton, where they not only took first place but set a new North Texas Relay record, 3:26.1.

He was one of the six cindermen chosen to carry Howard Payne's Colors to the Lawrence-Kansas meet April 17-18 which features top track men from over the nation, and on to the Drake Relays at Des Moines, Iowa on April 24-25.

Morrow won a track scholarship to Howard Payne. He set a record in the district in 1958 in the 100 and 220 yard dashes. He ran a 9.9 in the 100 and a 23.4 in the 220. One of these records still stands.

Dried Flower Arrangements

Glycerin-treated leaves are well worth the time spent in preparing them. They last indefinitely once they are processed. Cut branches when leaves are fully matured and full of moisture. Select leaves which have a tough texture, such as magnolia and sycamore. Wash foliage to remove dust and dirt. Cut out defective leaves and crush the woody stem so it will absorb the glycerin solution. Several inches of stem should be immersed and allowed to stand for several weeks. Use half water and half glycerin. Instead of glycerin one might use 1 cup sugar, 1 cup vinegar, and 2 cups water.

To dry flowers naturally, pick at the height of development and strip off the foliage. Tie in bunches and hang with heads down to prevent undesirable shapes. Hang in a dry place until dried. An attic is an ideal place to dry if light can be excluded. Light will rob flowers of their natural color while drying.

A seldom used closet will do for a drying place. But a basement or garage is too damp. Flowers will mold.

Although most flowers should be dried upside down, dry some of the plumed type of cockscomb and salvia in a tall container so that their heads hang over the edge.

Grasses are easy to do. Some are picked while green, others while brown. But all are dried upright in a peach basket. The same treatment applies to seed pods.

New State Law Requires Mud Flaps For Duals

AUSTIN — Colonel Homer Garrison, Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, said today that under a new state law it is now illegal to operate dual-wheeled vehicles on the highways without mud-flaps on the rear to protect drivers in back of them.

The law, which formerly applied only when the pavement was wet, now requires mud flaps in all kinds of weather for certain vehicles. It became effective April 2, 1959.

Under regulations issued by the Department, Garrison said, the flaps may be made of metal, rubber, rubberized material or other substantial material rigid enough to prevent mud, slush, gravel or other matter from being thrown from the rear of a dual-wheeled vehicle into the windshield of a vehicle following.

Pole trailers, truck tractors operated alone and without being in combination with a semi-trailer, and all trucks operated on private property do not come under the provisions of the new law.

Office Machines Job Exam Planned By Civil Service

New examinations for teletypist and operators of miscellaneous office machines have been announced by the U. S. Civil Service Commission for filling positions in various Federal agencies in Washington, D. C., and vicinity, and in overseas areas. Teletypist positions pay \$3,465 and \$3,755 a year. Office Machine Operator positions, from \$3,255 to \$3,755 a year.

To qualify for these positions, applicants must pass a written test. In addition, they must have had training or experience in operating a teletypewriter or an appropriate office machine.

Applications will be accepted until further notice and must be filed with the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Further information and application forms may be obtained from the Cisco Post Office or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C.

Choosing a Steak for Broiling
A tender broiled steak makes any meal or picnic a real occasion. Extension foods and nutrition specialists have some suggestions for selecting a steak for broiling over a charcoal fire.

First, look for a well-marbled steak. By marbeling we mean a steak when fat is interspersed within the lean. A well-marbeled steak will usually be tender and juicy when broiled — if it came from a young beef animal.

The food shopper has no way of judging this last point but Federal meat graders do — and the shopper can take advantage of their knowledge by using U. S. grades as a guide in selecting a picnic steak.

USDA Prime and Choice grades provide steaks which are best for broiling. You can easily tell if beef is Federally graded. On the fat covering you will find one or more purple shield-shaped stamps enclosing the grade name and the letters USDA. This shield grade mark is registered in the U.S. Patent Office for your protection.

In addition to knowing the grades of beef that are good for broiling, it is important to know what cuts are appropriate.

Porterhouse, T-bone, sirloin, and club steaks are the best. However, a rib steak compared favorably with these in tenderness and flavor, and usually does cost less per pound.
For a delightfully, well-rounded meal — one with good taste as well as flavor — select your broiling steak with a careful eye, and get that one that best suits the needs of the occasion.

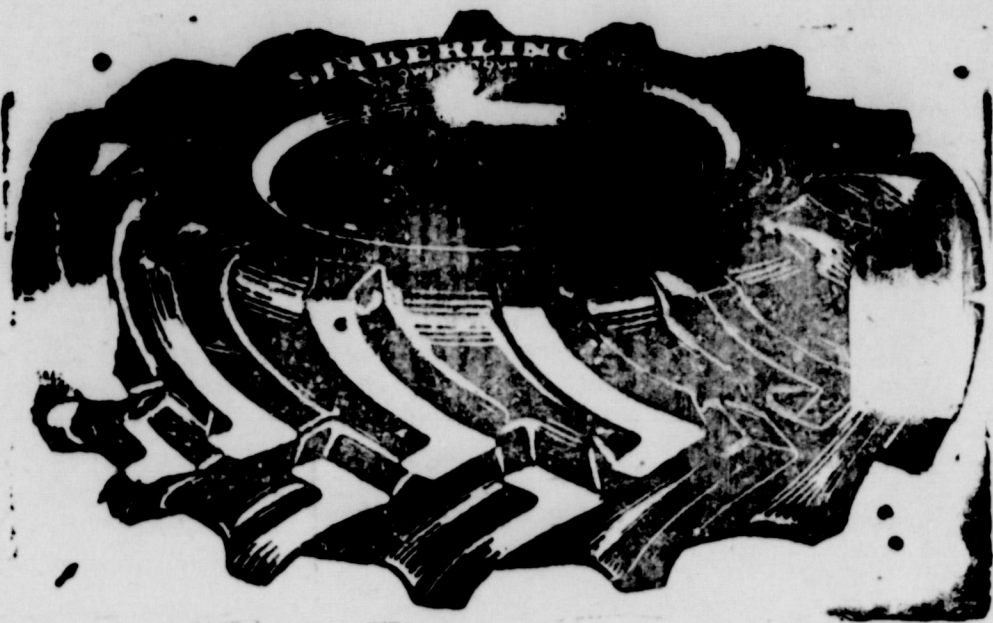

Changing Draft Card Dates Will Carry Penalties

AUSTIN, April 18. — Young men who change birth dates or Selective Service numbers on draft registration certificates are now subject to immediate induction into the Army as delinquents.

President Eisenhower has authorized this by executive order revising the Selective Service regulations, Colonel Morris S. Schwartz, state Selective Service director, said Tuesday.

Young men in numerous instances have been changing birth dates and draft numbers on the card certificates they carry on their persons so as to indicate an age of 21 or more.

"They have done this," Colonel Schwartz said, "for the purpose of falsely representing that they are eligible to purchase beer or liquor, or to be admitted to places forbidden by law to persons under 21."

Colonel Schwartz said that possession of an altered registration certificate is a violation of the draft act, but it has been difficult to prosecute successfully these cases in the absence of intent to evade service or defraud.

Swimming Pool Is Preparing To Open New Season

Preparations are underway to open the Lake Cisco swimming pool about May 1, it was reported by officials of the John William Butts Post 123 of the American Legion, operators of the pool. Work crews have been busy at the pool during the past week.

The pool always opens around May 1 for the benefit of large numbers of student groups. A number of schools have made reservations for parties at the park next month and many others are expected, officials said.

"The amendment of Section 1617.1 of the draft regulations," the state director commented, will permit local boards, if they desire, under the provisions of Section 1642.4, to declare men delinquent when they fail to possess certificates which have not been changed or altered.

"Men so declared delinquent are ordered for induction ahead of other men by reason of the delinquency," the state director concluded.

Questions & Answers

Q - I have a dental condition which resulted from an injury on maneuvers while in service but for which I am not entitled to receive compensation. Is there any deadline in my case for applying for out patient dental treatment?

A - No. Veterans whose service-connected noncompensable dental conditions or disabilities resulted from service injuries may apply at any time and receive as many treatments as are needed.

Q - I'm a Korea veteran going to school part-time under the GI Bill. To help me plan my school program to get in courses I need for graduation credits, please tell me how long a time I have to complete my training.

A - You have eight years from the date of your discharge to complete training under the Korean GI Bill. But you may not train beyond January 31, 1965.

Q - Because of financial difficulties I'm finding it hard to make the payments on my World War Two permanent plan GI life insurance. Could I change to some permanent plan with a lower premium?

A - Yes. That is possible. For example, if you are now paying on a 20-year endowment policy you could change to ordinary life. This is different from the wording on your policy which says no change is possible. However, the law governing the wording on your policy has been changed.

Q - I receive a monthly compensation check from VA for a disability incurred in Korea service. Does this automatically entitle me to vocational rehabilitation training?

A - No. The law requires that a disabled veteran be in need of vocational training to overcome the handicap of his disability. If need should be established in your case, you would be permitted to train.
