ANNUAL ORCHARD FIELD DAY TO BE HELD AT NIMROD IN MARCH

A home fruit supply will be stressed at the annual Eastland County Orchard Field Day to be held at Nimrod on March 24 according to information today from J. M. Cooper, county agent. Decision to continue to hold the annual fruit day was made recently at a meeting of the County Program Planning Committee. The group helps plan and advises on activities and programs of the county Extension Service personnel according to Mr. Cooper.

The latest information on soils, varieties, fertilizers, management, pruning and spraying as determined by research and experience will be brought to those attending by some of the top horticulturists of the state it was said by those planning the program for the all day affair.

Peaches, plums, grapes, pears, berries and figs will be fruits covered, with the morning session to be held in the Nimrod Community Club House. After lunch the group will have a field session in the Herman Schaefer orchard, east of the Community Center.

Horticulturists invited to be on the program include B. G. Hancock of the A&M College Extension Service; Tom Denman, Agricultural Experiment Station, Stephenville; and U. A. Randolph of the Agricultural Experiment Station, Montague. Others will be J. W. Foster of Weatherford and Bob Perkins of Eastland.

The sales goal for selling U. S. H United States Savings Bonds for 1959 for Texas has been set at \$182,500,000, it was reported by Nathan Adams, state chairman of the savings bond drive.

January purchases of the bonds totaled \$16,147,649 or 8.8 percent of the goal. Of the national goal of \$5,000,000,000 for 1959, 9.7 percent of the goal was reached in January, Mr. Adams stated.

Fat Lambs Will Head Entries At County Show

Fat lambs will be the largest division of the annual Eastland County Livestock Show March 20-21, according to W. B. Eaves, General Superintendent who reports that 158 lamb entries had been turned in to him.

The show this year will be on the new show grounds between the Lakeside Country Club and Lake Eastland, Ed Harrison, Gorman, president of the Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association that sponsors the two day show said recently.

Besides entries of the lambs, Eaves reported that there will be 27 fat calves, 126 fat pigs, 53 head of swine in the breeding division, 36 head of sheep and only 28 head of dairy cows and heifers.

The beef cattle and goat divisions will be small, Eaves reported.

The livestock show catalog is expected to be out in the near future and will show several changes. One is that all goats and sheep (except fat lambs) will be judged on the afternoon of March 20. Another change is that either the exhibitor or some member of his or her immediate family must be a member of the County Livestock Raisers Association to be eligible to show. This is in lieu of a stall fee in order to raise money to develop the show grounds and buildings.

The dairy division will no longer be a classification show as it has been for many years.

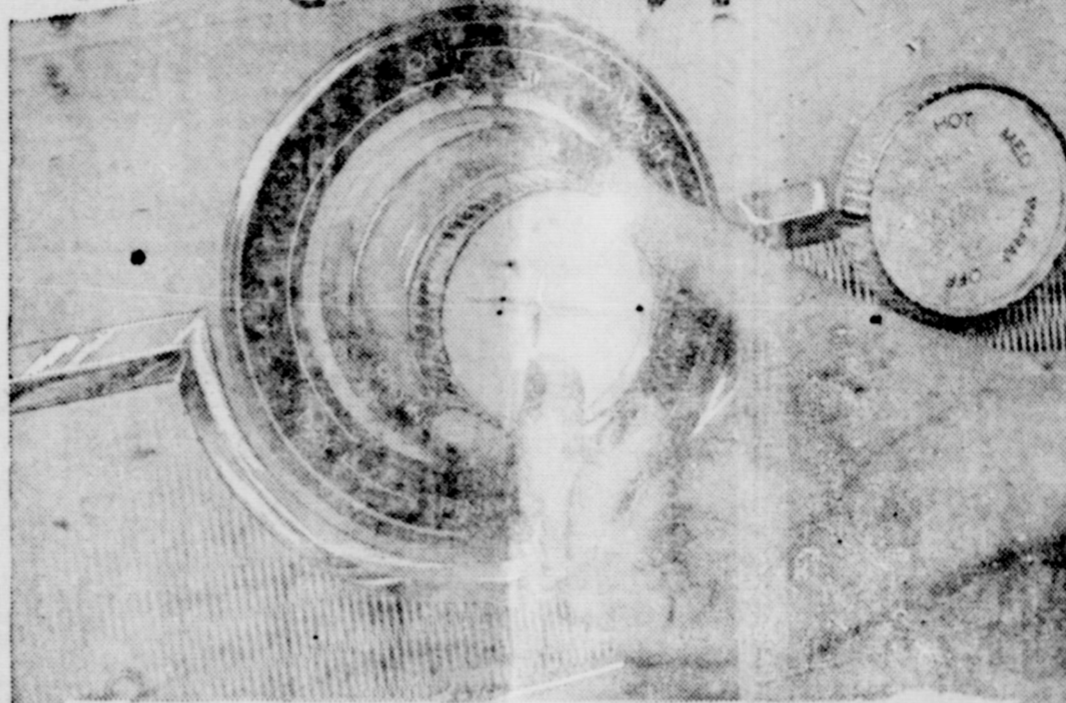

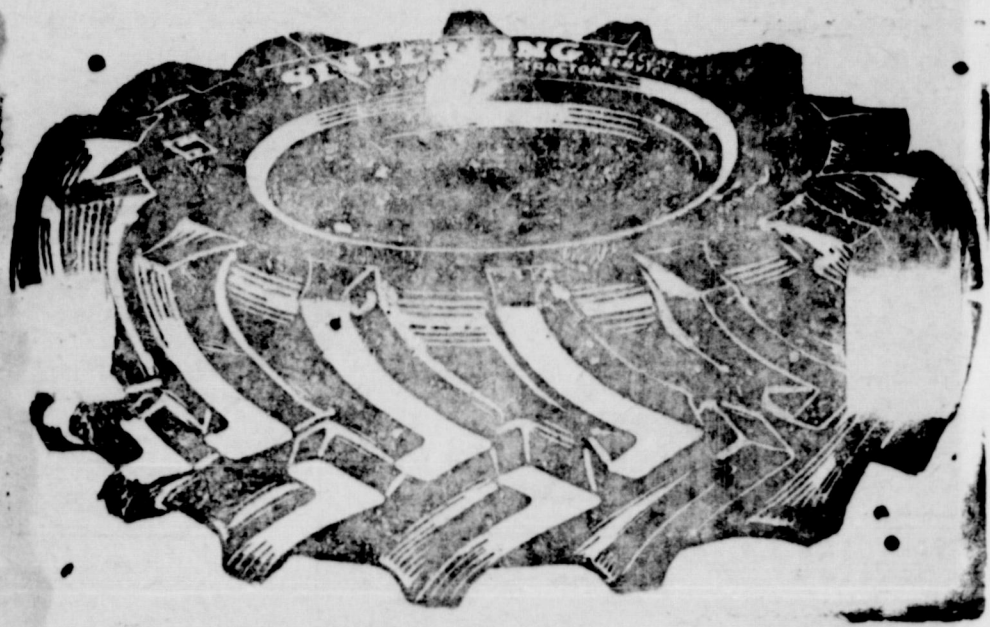

Humble's Earnings In 1958 Indicate Income Decrease

Preliminary estimates of Humble Oil and Refining Company's 1958 earnings indicate that the company's net income fell \$39,410,400 below 1957 figures.

In a letter to shareholders and employees, Morgan J. Davis, Humble president, said net income in 1958 was about \$136,500,000 or \$1.89 a share. This is about 56 cents a share less than 1957 when net income totaled \$175,910,400.

Mr. Davis pointed out that on the shareholders investment this represents a return of less than ten percent which is considerably below the average return realized by manufacturing corporations.

Gross revenue last year was \$116,898,000 below that of 1957. Most of the decrease occurred in sales of crude oil because of substantially reduced volumes. Revenue from sales of petrochemicals and petroleum products also decreased because of lower volumes and slightly lower prices.

However, Mr. Davis said the company's sales of natural gas continued to grow and in 1958 these sales accounted for more than \$65,000,000 of Humble's total revenue.

Costs, expenses and taxes were \$77,500,000 less than in 1957. Lower purchases of crude oil and

products, together with a \$28,203,000 decrease in dry hole costs primarily because of reduced drilling, accounted for most of the change. Humble drilled 557 wells in 1958, compared with 887 in 1957.

Humble's total tax bill in 1958 amounted to \$110,000,000, including excise taxes on products sold.

Capital expenditures in 1958 totaled \$154,900,000 and were \$80,500,000 less than the record program of 1957.

Cisco Area Gets New Wildcat Drilling Location

The B&W Drilling Company, located temporarily in Cisco, has made application to drill No. 1 Bible, on a wildcat location approximately 17 miles southwest of Cisco in the Nimrod community.

Located on the A. L. Bible place of the W. H. Lauderdale estate, the well was spotted 1,465 feet from the south and 1,479 feet from the east lines of Henry Applewhite Survey. Proposed depth is 3,000 feet with rotary.

While drilling in Eastland County, B&W will have their headquarters in the offices of Beatrice Guthrie. Headed by Ben Wirkkala, B&W is from Oregon.

Elsewhere in the county, Magnolia Petroleum Co. of Dallas completed No. 1 First National Bank of Fort Worth, Trustess, as a regular field producer eight miles northwest of Eastland in Section 63, Block 4, H&TC Survey.

Daily potential was 79.34 barrels of 44.5 gravity oil, flowing through an 8-64-inch choke with 150 pounds of pressure on casing and 225 on tubing.

Flow was from 60 perforations at 4,060-75 feet. Casing was set at 4,079 feet, with the hole plugged back to 4,076 feet. Gas-oil ratio was 392-1.
