CRUSHED BY ICE; 100 TO 300 LOST

St. Paul, Minn., April 2.—The worst disaster to the sealing fleet for over twenty years. "The gist of a wireless message received here to-day by the Marconi Co. from the Bay station.

"Sealers from the steamer New Foundland," the message added, "were caught in a blizzard. Fifty men found dead on the ice. Men from other ships are searching for the remainder to-day."

Curling, New Foundland, April 2.—Reports received here to-day stated that the sealing steamer New Foundland was lost off Cape Race and the greater part of her crew of 170 men perished. No word has been received of the sealer Southern Cross, reported in trouble in the same vicinity Tuesday. Rescue ships have picked up fifty bodies of the crew of the New Foundland.

VILLA CAPTURES TORREON AT LAST

Juarez, April 2.—Torreon fell completely into the hands of the rebels at 10:20 o'clock tonight, according to announcement made here tonight by Gen. Venustiano Carranza.

The news first was announced to the world when the bugler in front of Carranza's residence blew the staccato notes of victory. The paen Carranza said was sounded here even before it was heard in Torreon. Villa delaying out of compliment to his chief.

The meagre bulletins excitedly announcing victory after the bloodiest series of battles known to modern Mexico said that Villa captured a large number of prisoners and that the fleeing federal remnant was being pursued.

Whether Velasco, the federal commander was captured was not stated. There was heavy fighting today, it is understood, and the end came when, after capturing the three remaining barracks held in the city by the federals, the rebels stormed the trenches and barbed wire entanglements of Canyon Del Guarache.

The prisoners captured are believed to have been the defenders of the barracks while the troops in the canyon which forms an egress from the hill-girdled city, were able to escape.

FLOATING ON BIG LAKE OF OIL

There has been more or less talk of oil throughout this section of the state for a long time, but not until recently has there been real business talk. It seems that the big oil companies have selected a strip of country extending South from the Electra oil fields North of Wichita Falls to Ballinger. Geologists have been put on the job, and after making a number of surveys at different points, their reports have caused drills to begin to puncture the earth, and there is much enthusiasm where splendid oil indications have been found.

During the last few weeks, at least a half dozen representatives of oil companies have visited Ballinger and without making known the object of their visit they have made inquiries that lead those who are on the inside to believe that the territory around Ballinger is under investigation. At present there is a man in the field, but we have been denied the privilege of an interview with him, at least an interview for publication.

It will be remembered that we published an account of the visit of a prominent capitalist and Ballinger property owner to this town a few days since, and also a statement he made while here, to the effect that he would begin at an early date the sinking of a test well near here.

The Abilene Reporter in publishing an account of the progress being made in developing the fields in the Moro country says:

"That there is oil in abundance in a strip of territory in the Moro country has not been doubted. A geologist employed by B. M. Burks upon whose place the indications appear so prominently rendered a report in which it was shown that there is a considerable fountain of oil under the ground at a depth of between 900 and 1,000 feet, which is of very fine quality and could easily be transformed into lubricant. This geologist has determined that there is considerable oil in places about the Moro country other than that upon which specific testing has been made."

Parties returning from Stamford report that there is considerable excitement in that town over the discovery of a splendid grade of oil, and a press report from Stamford says:

The big oil companies of the state are taking a live interest in the oil developments in this section. There will be seen in the fact that a deal has just been consummated whereby a representative of one of the largest companies of the state secured a lease upon a twenty-five hundred acre tract just east of the Colbert ranch, upon which well No. one of the Jones County Oil Company has a well with a good showing of oil is located. The usual one-eighth royalty was given by the company and in addition to this an appreciable bonus was paid, development to begin within ninety days. The lease was given by John D. Hughes of Georgetown, Texas.

In speaking of the matter Mr. Hughes said, "I have every confidence in the belief that pay oil or gas, or both, will be found, and I gave the lease upon my tract of land, because I wanted to see immediate development."

The Jones County Oil and Gas Company has one-half of the R. V. Colbert ranch of fifteen thousand acres under lease, and representatives of the big companies are now negotiating with Mr. Colbert for the other portion. Many other deals are pending, and there is the greatest activity and interest in the developments.

POINEER STOCKMAN LAID TO REST

From San Angelo Standard:

Seldom if ever before in the history of San Angelo has a more representative citizenship been present than that which attended the funerals of Henry Clay Wylie and G. Berry Ketchum in this city Wednesday afternoon. Coming within an hour of each other, many who attended the funeral of Mr. Ketchum also joined in the long procession way from the Wylie residence on West Twobig avenue to Fairmont. Both the deceased being pioneer cattlemen of the West and beloved and honored citizens of San Angelo, men in every walk of life, not only from San Angelo but from many of the surrounding town gathered to pay their last respects to the honored dead.

At 3 o'clock, one hour earlier than had at first been announced, services over the remains of Berry Ketchum, the Pecos county cattleman who died Tuesday morning, were conducted at the parlors of the C. A. Robinson Undertaking Co., by Rev. A. J. Weeks, pastor of the First Methodist church. Friends from all sections of the country gathered about the bier and among them the following acted as pall bearers: W. A. Bell, Clint Johnson, C. H. Powell, John R. Nasworthy, Jerry Y. Rust and Ed Russell.

Scarcely had the last of the beautiful floral offerings been placed on the grave until the casket which bore the remains of Henry Clay Wylie were carried by the following to a waiting hearse: W. P. Humphrey of San Angelo, W. E. Allen, C. H. Wingham, D. M. Baker, J. Y. Pearce and J. F. Currie of Ballinger. Previously impressive services had been conducted in the home by Rev. Robert E. Joiner, pastor of the Harris Avenue Presbyterian church. The funeral procession which followed was one of the longest in recent years, while floral offerings at the grave were the most beautiful to be procured.

Seized with illness only last week, Mr. Wylie slowly sank until the end and his death Tuesday proved a great shock to his friends, many of whom were informed of his illness. Having resided in Ballinger for many years a large concourse of friends from the Runnels county metropolis attended the funeral.

RABBIT HUNT NEAR BENOIT

At a late hour the hunters returned home, all carrying a green spot in their memory of the pleasant day and hospitality of the good people of that neighborhood.

Judge Jno. W. Goodwin came up from Brownwood and finished up the business of the present term of court and closed the court for the March term. The only business coming before the court was the final settlement of the Weber divorce suit. It will be remembered that the court granted Mrs. Weber a divorce last week, and deferred the matter of the division of the property until Thursday of this week. In the adjustment of this matter Judge Goodwin granted an equal division of the exempt property of the Weber estate.

A new hearing was granted in the damage suit case C. E. Jordan vs. Dr. Bell. This is a case in which Mr. Jordan brought suit against Bell for damages in failing to comply with contract of sale.

REV. J. C. JESTER CALLED TO BALLINGER CHURCH

Rev. J. C. Jester, of the Southwestern Baptist Theological seminary has accepted a call to the pastorate of the First Baptist church of Ballinger, and will leave for there Saturday morning, where he will fill the pulpit in the Sunday services. Rev. Mr. Jester will succeed Rev. Bartow Broome, who recently resigned and accepted a call to the Baptist church of Granger.

For the last three years Rev. Mr. Jester has been a student at the local Baptist seminary, and is taking his T. H. M. degree this term. Although he will be pastor of the Ballinger church he will continue his course at the seminary, being in Ballinger only on Sunday. About June 1, he with his family, will make Ballinger their headquarters.—Fort Worth Record.

DALLAS GETS REGIONAL BANK

Washington, April 3.—After three months of consideration the reserve banks organization committee last night announced that it had divided the continental United States into twelve banking districts and selected twelve cities for Federal reserve banks under the new currency law. This was the first decisive step toward the establishment of the new system. The cities and districts are:

District No. 1, Boston: Reserve bank will have capital of \$9,931,740, with 446 National banks as members.

District No. 2, New York: Capital \$20,678,616; with 478 National and a number of State banks (not given) as members.

District No. 3, Philadelphia: Capital, \$12,993,013, including 800 National banks and several State banks.

District No. 4, Cleveland: Capital, \$11,621,535; with 724 National and several State banks.

District No. 6, Atlanta: Capital, \$4,702,780; with 372 National banks, etc.

District No. 7, Chicago: Capital, \$6,219,323 with 424 National banks, etc.

District No. 9, Minneapolis: Capital, \$4,702,864, with 687 National banks, etc.

District No. 10, Kansas City: Capital, \$5,594,916, with 835 National banks, etc.

District No. 11, Dallas: Capital, \$5,634,091, with 726 National banks, etc.

District No. 12, San Francisco: Capital, \$8,115,524, with 514 National banks, etc.

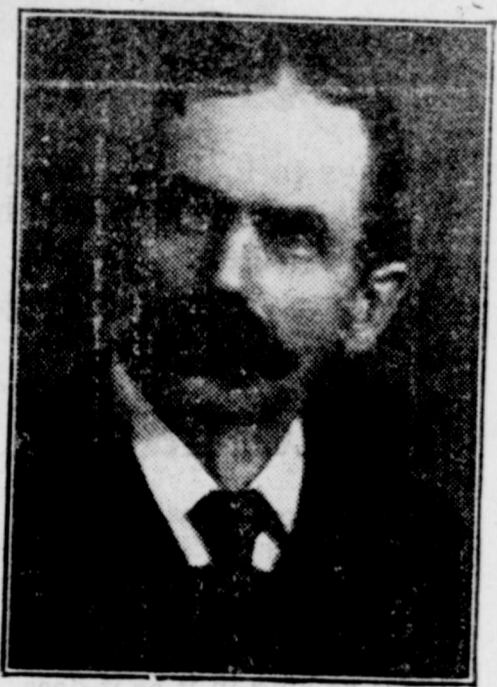
