## Eastland County Farm Bureau Head Attends Meeting

Attending the fourth annual Farm Bureau President's conference in Austin January 18-19 from Eastland County was John Love of Ranger, Eastland County Farm Bureau President.

The meeting, which reviewed plans and ideas to be used in the county organization, presented recommendations for the program of work in each county in 1959.

Principal speaker at the conference was Charles B. Shuman, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation. At the statewide meeting, the county presidents were presented the national policies adopted at the annual AFBF convention in Boston last December. Also featured at the meeting was a discussion on the importance of the county Farm Bureaus in national policies.

## Farm Population Appears Stable For Past Year

COLLEGE STATION, Jan. 15.—The sharp decline in Texas farm population which occurred in 1956-57 does not appear to have continued during 1957-58, reports R. L. Skrabanek, professor, Department of Agricultural Economics and Sociology, Texas A&M College.

Skrabanek attributes this temporary reversal partly to the economic recession which tended to retard movement from farms because of a drop in the number of off-farm job opportunities. He said there also is some evidence that the recession caused the return of some workers to farm areas.

The 1958 farm population figure of 1,022,000 represents a decline of 335,000, or 24 percent, from the estimated farm population in 1950. It represents an increase of 34,000 from the 1957 estimate of 1,018,999.

As Texas' total population continues to grow, the proportion of farm population to the total population continues to decline. In April, 1958, farm residents comprised 11.3 percent of the total population, as compared to 17.9 percent in 1950.

This decline represents a continuation of a long-time trend. In 1910, about three of every five persons in Texas resided on a farm. The proportion living on farms continued to fall during intervening years, interrupted only during depression years and brief periods since World War II.

U.S. farm population in April, 1958, was 20,827,000. The proportion of the nation's farm population living in Texas remains relatively the same. In 1957 about 4.99 of every 100 farm people in the nation resided in Texas. In 1958 the state's share was 5.05 out of every 100.

## No Changes Are Made In County Crop Program

The 1959 ACP Program has the in 1958, according to a report by Emmett E. Powell, office manager of the Eastland County ASC.

The county office should be notified of any changes of farm owners or operators for 1959 so that the records can be changed, Mr. Powell said. Applications for the new peanut grower allotments should be made soon. Requirement for receiving the allotment include two years of experience within the past five years growing peanuts and depending on the farm for a living. Similar requirements are necessary for the new cotton grower allotment with the exception that experience is not required.

Final dates for applications are February 13, 1959, for new grower peanut allotments; February 16, 1959, for new grower cotton allotments; for reapportioned acreage, April 10, 1959; for release of cotton and peanut allotments, April 3, 1959.

In the near future, each producer will be asked to choose which plan he wishes to follow, Mr. Powell stated. If a producer chooses to follow choice A plan, he will plant within the regular allotment and receive 80 percent of parity as the support price. If he chooses choice B plan, he may exceed the original allotment by 40 percent and receive 15 percent of parity less than choice A.

Hampton, formerly of Cisco, was awarded a pin engraved with the slogan, "Home Is Where the Heart Is", and her winning examination paper will be entered in competition with those of other winners in the state in the contest to choose the state Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow.

## County Sold 142% Of Savings Bond Quota Last Year

The 1958 Savings Bonds sales in Eastland County totaled \$724,425 or 142.9 percent of the 1953 goal, Guy Peyton Parker, chairman of the Eastland County Savings Bonds committee announced.

December sales in Eastland County were \$53,448. In Texas the December sales were 15 percent greater than those of December 1957. Total state sales for the year were \$171,851,685 or 98.2 percent of the year's goal. Sales in the nation last year were \$4,689 million.

While sales increased 4 percent last year, redemptions of matured and unmatured bonds decreased 11 percent, Mr. Parker

### Almond Chicken With Rice

Chinese Chicken Almond With Rice, a delightful delicately flavored dish with chicken, celery topping, is sure to please your family. It makes an attractive "one main dish type meal" and is easily served to a crowd.

Fresh or canned mushrooms may be used for making Chinese Almond Chicken.

**INGREDIENTS**  
1 cup uncooked rice  
1 cup sliced mushrooms (canned or fresh)  
1 cup almonds — blanched  
2 tablespoons salad oil, to be used 1 tablespoon at a time  
1 clove garlic, cut in half  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 cup cubed bamboo shoots (canned)  
1 cup thinly sliced water chestnuts (canned)  
1 cup thinly sliced celery  
1 cup diced, cold chicken (fresh or canned)  
1 tablespoon liquid (1 tablespoon each, from bamboo shoots and water chestnut cans)

**INGREDIENTS FOR GRAVY**  
2 teaspoons cornstarch  
1/2 teaspoon sugar  
1/2 teaspoon water  
4 teaspoons soy sauce

**GARNISH**  
1 cup sliced green onion

**PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE**—To make 3 cups fluffy rice: Put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 3 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt in a two-

quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil. Then reduce the heat as low as possible and steam for 14 minutes or until all the water is absorbed, leaving the separate rice grains with their full nutritional value. This makes very firm rice grains. (If you prefer more tender rice grains, add 1/4 cup more water and increase the slow cooking time 4 or 5 minutes.) Remove the lid, permit the rice to steam dry to the desired consistency and the grains will be separate and fluffy. Never stir rice; lift gently with a fork.

**METHOD:** Brown almonds in 1 tablespoon oil. Set aside. With table fork, mash garlic into salt in skillet. (Be sure there is a tight-fitting cover, which can be used later.) Add 1 tablespoon oil, then add chicken. Brown lightly. Add 1 tablespoon oil and then bamboo shoots and mushrooms. Brown lightly. Add liquid, drained from canned bamboo shoots and water chestnuts. Cover tightly. Cook over low heat 5 minutes. Add water chestnuts, celery and 1/2 of the almonds. Just heat through. Celery and chestnuts should remain crisp. For gravy... shake up in small jar, cornstarch, salt, sugar, water and soy sauce. Stir into mixture. Cook until liquid thickens and is smooth. Sprinkle over dish, green onions and rest of almonds. Serve with hot fluffy cooked rice. This will serve 4.

## NOTICE TO VEHICLE OWNERS Title A Prerequisite To Registration

The "Texas Title Act", which became effective on October 1, 1939, provides, with named exceptions, that a certificate of title is a prerequisite to registration. Section 63 (b) reads as follows:

"The Department or any agent thereof shall not after the 1st of January, 1942, register or renew the registration of any motor vehicle, unless and until the owner thereof shall make application for and be granted an official certificate of title for such vehicle or present satisfactory evidence that a certificate of title for such vehicle has been previously issued to such owner by the Department. Provided, however this shall not apply to automobiles which were purchased new prior to January 1, 1936."

In order that the terms of the above law and, also instructions from the Texas Department may be complied with, it will be necessary for this office to require that the certificate of title and the 1958 license receipt be presented before the 1959 license plates can be issued. You should check now to see whether or not you have your title certificate. If it has been lost you should contact this office to secure the proper forms to be used.

This office has also been instructed to not recognize a title receipt (Form 31) as evidence that title has been issued unless such receipt has been issued within the last thirty (30) days prior to your application for plates. If title has not been issued within this period of time, there is a possibility that it has been rejected by the State Highway Department.

**A Notice To All Commercial Vehicle Owners By The State Highway Department**

"We have established certain standards governing the empty weight of commercial vehicles. As the Tax Collectors Reports are received in our office, each license receipt will be checked for minimum empty weight and carrying capacity. Each registration that does not meet the minimum weight requirements will be investigated by our office or the Department of Public Safety. We will contact the owner and advise him to contact the Tax Collectors office immediately for additional weight to be issued. The law grants us the authority to cancel the owners title, if the proper registration fee is not paid. It should be remembered that empty weight cannot be lowered from the weight shown on the title and registration receipt unless supported by a scale ticket, regardless of the chart."

### Poll Tax Sales Slow As Deadline Date Draws Near

A receipt costs \$1.75 but no fee is charged persons who are exempt. Exemptions include persons who became 21 years of age after January 1, 1959, or will become 21 years of age 30 days prior to an election and persons who became 60 years of age before January 1, 1959. Although exempt persons need not pay their poll tax, they are required to renew their exemption certificate annually. Either husband or wife may sign the exemption for both.
