
CANNOT ADVISE HOW TO BALLOT

Murder Mystery; 600 View Corpse

GALVESTON, July 22.—The mystery of the murdered woman who was found early yesterday morning on Denver beach half covered with sand which had been washed upon her body by the tide during the night, deepened today when several hundred persons viewed the corpse and a fail-

ure to identify the woman was the result.

It is variously reported here that the body is that of either Mrs. Alma Johnson of Dallas or Mrs. W. H. Hopper of Cleburne. The authorities are not positive that it is of either. Officers continued today to try to find some clue which would lead up to the identification of the woman.

Administration and R. R. Monopoly to Clash

WASHINGTON, July 22.—An eleventh hour surrender by the New York, New Haven and Hartford railway directors was the slender thread upon which hung the issue of war between the railroad monopoly and the American administration. However, it is pointed out that the war is bound

to come since there is little likelihood of the directors surrendering.

Secretary McReynolds of the attorney general's department is totally prepared to execute President Wilson's orders to file suit under the Sherman Act for a dissolution of the concern and to institute proceedings of criminal nature against the directors.

OAT THRASHERS BEHIND WITH WORK

Many of our town readers have no idea what a busy time it is on the farms of Runnels county, and all because they seldom get away from their business and make visits to the country. There was never a day in the history of Runnels county when there was as much work demanding the attention of the farmers as there has been throughout the present season.

We are reliably informed that the grain thrashers are far behind with their work, and that it will be the first of September before the oat crop is safe in the bins.

While the grain crop is not more than one-half thrashed, the largest maize and feterita crop ever raised in this county is rapidly maturing and will soon demand the attention of the farmers. In many fields another plowing is needed to keep the cotton growing.

The writer heard a farmer remark this week, "We have had plenty time to frolic around the past two or three summers, but I see no chance for a vacation this summer." A rain within the next week or two will put the finishing touch on the largest cotton crop ever grown in this county.

WOULD PASS ORDINANCE

"If the city of Ballinger," said Postmaster J. J. Erwin, "has no ordinance whereby the property owners may be forced to clean their premises, I would suggest that the council meet in special session at once and pass one. The organization subscribed \$400 which will be offered as a reward for the capture of the murderer of A. C. Pemberton, a rural grocer in this county, who was murdered while sleeping early to day.

BALLINGER MEN BEING FLOODED WITH LETTERS; ALL WANT TO COME BACK

Declaring that the prospects for a large cotton crop in all sections of eastern Texas, southern Texas, northern Texas, Oklahoma and Arkansas are slim, indeed, and that the writers would desire to return to Runnels county to again make their home, scores of letters are arriving daily in Ballinger from people who want to get back to this part of the state to help handle what promises to be the greatest cotton crop in the history of the county.

In every mail arriving here, letters come from all parts of Texas, Oklahoma and Arkansas from single people and from married people. Some writers of letters have as many as ten people in their families and they express their desire to return to Grand Old Runnels to again take up their abode.

John A. Weeks is being flooded with letters these days. He intends to answer each of the letters and see that his prospectors reach Ballinger when the right time comes, which will be next month barring a calamity which might strike this country. Some of the men who have written him state they want to rent a hundred acres of land, while others say they want to buy rights clean. The majority, however want only to work for salaries.

Postmaster J. J. Erwin is being kept busy these days handling his mail from the same territory from whence Mr. Weeks' letters came. Many of his writers express a desire to return to Ballinger and some want to buy tracts of land since conditions are so promising. Many letters are also coming addressed to the secretary of chamber of commerce.

It is estimated at least five hundred persons will come to Ballinger to help handle the cotton crop if every one of the letters which had arrived at noon today were

answered and the prospector brought to this county. Approximately one hundred letters have arrived and an average of five is a very good estimate of the size of each man's family.

That many of the prospectors will return to Runnels county is an assured fact, now, if the letters can be used as an indication. They have heard of the prospects for the bumper crops in this part of the state and are anxious to return to Runnels after an absence of several years.

Mr. Weeks intends to collect all his letters after answering them and post them on a large board in front of his place of business on Hutchings avenue for the inspection of the farmers when they arrive in the city. The farmers can get in touch directly with the men and bring them to this country to handle the great crops which are in prospect.
