





INSTITUTIONS

Special to The Daily Ledger: HUNTSVILLE, Aug., 1.—There are 109 prisoners per 100,000 pop ulation confined in Texas penal in stutions, and the total number confined is 4,232, according to a report which has just been issued from the Census Bureau. About 60 per cent of the prisoners are negroes, 40 per cent are whites. In the entire United States there are 111,609 prisoners confined in penal institutions and the ratio is 121 per 100,000 population.
