CANDIDATES NEGLECT **VIOLATE LAW**

While it is not generally known but is a very severe penalty for failure to file statement by candidates of their expenses during their candidacy.

Following is the penal statute regulating said matter:

(Article 232 penal code 1911) Any candidate for any public office who fails to file with the coun ty judge of his county, within ten days after the date of a primary or general election, an itemized statement of all money or things of value paid or promised by him before or during his candidacy, for such office in cluding his traveling expenses, hotel bills and money paid to newspapers, and make affidavit to the correctness


