Gorman Man Is Elected Leader Livestock Ass'n.


The Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association recently elected Ed Harrison, a prominent Freeder of Gorman, as president of the Association for the coming year.

11 Area Churches To Take Part In Revival Campaign

DALLAS, Oct. 18. - Eleven Texas Baptist churches in the Cisco Association have agreed to participate in the 1959 North American simultaneous evangelistic crusade, said Dr. C. Wade Freeman, superintendent of evangelism, Baptist General Convention of Texas, this week.

A recent extended survey by the state evangelism department showed that 3,515 or 94.8 per cent of the denomination's churches in Texas will be included in the movement.

Additional statistics released by Dr. Freeman show that 3,508 churches will observe New Year's Eve prayer services this year, and 3,352 churches will schedule a "commitment to soul winning day," January 4, 1959. "This is the first time that all

major Baptist groups in North America have participated in such a drive. We hope the ef-fects of this year of revival will be worldwide with prayer periods and crusades scheduled in many foreign countries," said the veteran evangelist.

Texas crusade dates are Janu-ary 25-February 8, March 15-29, and April 12-26.

An estimated 70,000 baptisms will be recorded this year, said Dr. Freeman. Last year, BGCT churches reported 62,283 baptisms.

Theme for the simultaneous crusade is "New Life For You,"
