> Passing favorably on petitions containing 583 names the Com missioners Court set Saturday, March 4th for date of prohibition election. The matter of ordering the election was taken up just before court adjourned late Monday evening and the date promptly agreed upon by all the commissioners. The petition was presented as one petition, the various copies which had keen prepared and circulated in different sections of the county having been attached together. The largest number of signers from any one of the voting precincts where the petitions were circualted came from the Rowena box, there being something near 200 names on the petition circulated in that part of the county. The next largest was the Ballinger pettition and the third came from the Winters country. As the poll tax records show the largest number of poll tax payments in the history of the county it is expected that the largest vote ever polled in the county on any question will be brought out March th. Whiie the antis have not puthicly announced what tactics they will puruse in their efforts to reopen saloons in this county, the pros are busy and have publicly announced that aney will wage a strong campaign to keep the county in dry territory.
