Bobby Tucker Now Serving In Lebanon

Task Force 201, LEBANON - Army Pfc. Bobby L. Tucker, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Tucker, Route 1, Carbon, is serving with Task Force 201 in Lebanon. Task Force 201, made up of airborne elements of the 54th Infantry Division in Augsburg, Germany, landed in Beirut, Lebanon, on July 19.

The elements that were involved in the first phase of the operation were combat troops of the 1st Airborne Battle Group, 187th Infantry, and staff personnel of the 24th Infantry Division. This group was flown from Augsburg via Adana, Turkey, to Beirut in cargo type aircraft.

The second phase consisted of an air-lift of the support command of the task force made up of personnel from units throughout Europe. This group was air-lifted by cargo type aircraft which shuttled from Augsburg to Adana to Beirut and began landing in Beirut on July 21.

FIVE-YEAR CONTRACT PROGRAM REMAINS IN SOIL BANK PLANS

Plans for the soil bank program for 1959 to include only the five-year contract program were announced here Saturday by Emmett E. Powell, county office manager of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee of Eastland County.

The new program will require that the producer request the committee to set a payment rate on his farm, which the rate to be increased ten per cent if all land is placed under contract, Mr. Powell said. No soil bank base will be established if all the farm is placed in the program. Rental payments will not be made in ex-

cess of twenty percent of the land value. After the payment rate is set the producer may accept or reject the offer, Mr. Powell said.

The final date for requesting the committee to establish a rate on a farm is September 26, 1958, he said. The program is not to be on a "first-come-first-served" basis, but all requests will be considered and the best offers will be given a preference if there is a shortage of funds, Mr. Powell continued.

Any persons interested in the program may call at the county ASC office in the Courthouse for further details.

Slow down a bit on these hot summer days. Overexposure to the sun, to prolonged heat or hard physical labor in a hot or stuffy place can bring heat exhaustion quickly. In heatstroke, body temperature rises, skin becomes hot and dry, face reddens and headache develops. Heat exhaustion works just the reverse. The patient's body becomes cool, perhaps clammy, with sweat. The best treatment for both conditions

is preventative.

National Health Council recommends the following precautions:

1. Increase salt intake to offset excessive loss of salt in the body through perspiration. Salt intake can be increased by adding more salt to food, by drinking salted water, or by taking salt tablets.
2. Avoid overexertion and overexposure to direct sun rays or extreme indoor temperatures and high humidity.
3. Wear a hat while out-of-doors; wear light, porous clothing.
4. Eat nutritious foods, but avoid over-eating. Drink water often through the day, one glass at a time. Avoid ice water and

alcohol.

When heatstroke or heat exhaustion occurs, get a doctor at once and apply first aid treatment. In applying first aid, keep in mind this simple rule. If patient is chilled, cover and make him comfortably warm; if he is suffering from headache and skin becomes hot and dry, make him comfortably cool.

Good grooming is always important, and, is maybe a little more difficult during the hot summer months. A lovely garment often is spoiled by a lack of good grooming. On the other hand, a garment which in itself is not particularly distinctive may become attractive when worn by a well-groomed person.

Anyone can be well-groomed. Developing habits of good grooming early in childhood helps establish habits which will boost morale and appearance throughout life.

Summertime means more leisure time for most girls. It's a good time to start practicing better grooming habits that will carry through the school year ahead.

Special finishes now being used on many cottons, linens, and rayons give wrinkle-resistant, extra sheen and body to these fabrics. Problem now is, how to remove stains from fabrics that have these special finishes. Chlorine bleaches may be used on some. Other finishes are damaged by such treatment because special resins in the finish absorb

and retain chlorine.

Best rule to follow is to look for directions regarding use of bleaches on the garment. If no information is given, avoid use of chlorine bleaches on fabrics with special finishes. Some stains cannot be removed without bleaching. In such cases, use sodium perborate or a powdered bleach that contains it. Soak washable colorfast fabrics for several hours, or overnight if needed in a warm solution containing one or two tablespoons of sodium perborate to one pint of water. Another method is to sprinkle dry bleach on the dampened spot, then dip in a pan of very hot water for a few minutes. This reminder: Always check garments for stains before laundering, and remove. O

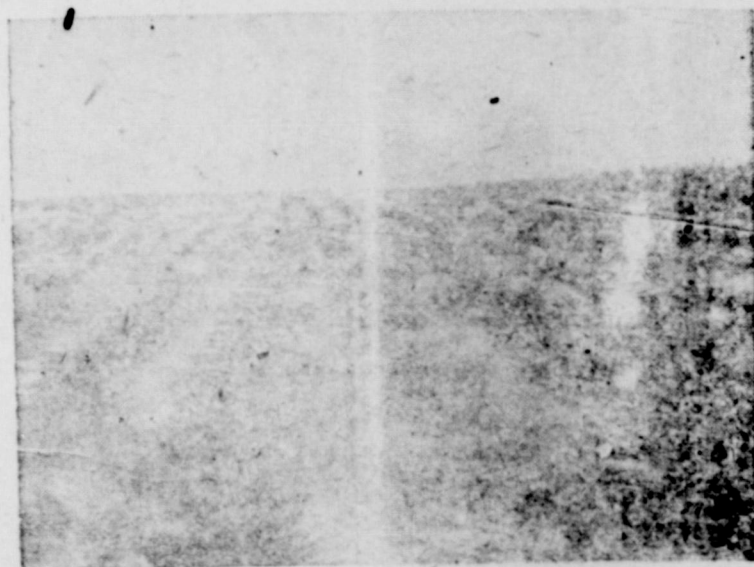

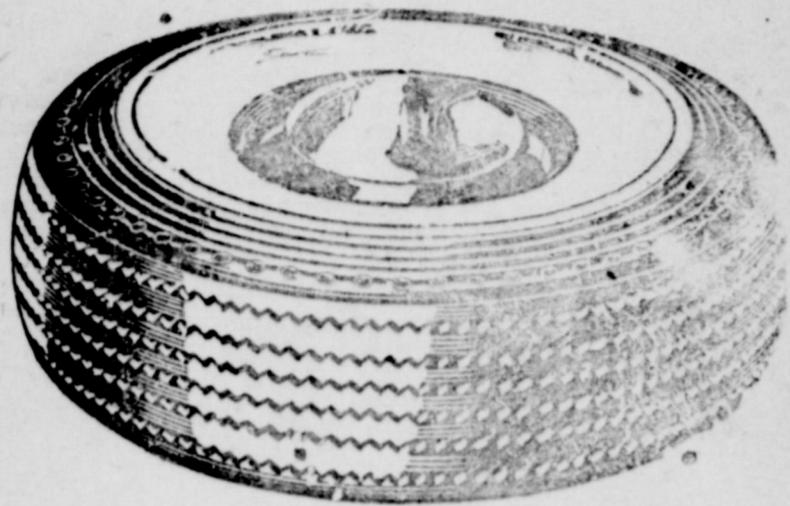

Work Is Expected To Begin In Near Future On Highway Link

Construction is expected to get underway in September on the Eastland County section of Interstate 20, new coast to coast super highway, it was announced by Gordon Smith, resident highway engineer in Eastland.

The contract has been let to Collins Construction Company of Austin, which was low bidder in the project. The State Highway Department opened bids Tuesday in Austin and Collins' was low with \$935,745.75. It was earlier

believed that the construction cost might exceed one million dollars.

The bid was for the 3.7 mile stretch which runs from the Erath County line to 7.2 miles east of Ranger, Smith said.

The project will include two interchanges and six bridges, according to Mr. Smith. The two overpasses, one 200 feet long and the other 190 feet long, will be located at the Highway 16 intersection and the Tudor Road between Strawn and Desdemona.

Completion of the work in the county will take some 275 working days, or about a year, Mr. Smith said. The highway will be a four-lane asphalt and concrete expressway. For the present it will be tied into U. S. Highway 80 giving Eastland County a divided highway from the Erath County line to west of Cisco.
