County Bond Sales Over \$54,000 in June

Savings bond sales in Eastland County totaled \$54,040 during the month of June, Guy Peyton Parker, chairman of the Eastland County bond committee, reported here Saturday.

The June sales brought the total for the year to \$408,632 in the county, representing 80.6 per cent of the county's yearly goal.

Sales in Texas for the first six months of 1958 were \$88,508,546, which was 34 per cent greater than the same period in 1957.

Dairy Business in Texas Is Growing

College Station, — If the trend toward handling bulk milk experienced in Texas during 1956 and 1957 continues at the same rate, it is doubtful that any Grade "A" milk will be handled in cans. A bulletin just released by the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station entitled "Bulk Handling of Milk on Texas Dairy Farms." The bulletin is a summary of information obtained in the North Texas and Corpus Christi areas during the spring and summer of 1957 on dairy farms which have converted their operations to the bulk system of producing and handling milk.

According to the bulletin, Texas dairy farmers are operating larger units, milking more cows, selling more milk and generally becoming more commercialized. They also are making efforts to increase their efficiency by utilizing methods which contribute to more efficient production and marketing of fluid milk.

County Results Of Saturday's Election

More than 5000 voters went to the polls in Saturday's Primary election and re-elected 3 county officers. Roy L. Lane won over Richard Cox by the vote of 3894 to 1494. Johnson Smith won over Arlton Smith 3709 to 1596 and John Hart defeated C. L. Garrett, 2794 to 2574 in the County Judge race.

In precinct 2 Commissioners face Bennett received 543 votes, Thurman 328 and Foster 217. There will be a run-off between Bennett and A. M. Thurman in this race.

Paul Brashear won over both opponents, Burkett and Dawson, for his return to the Legislature.

Lovegrass Found Profitable On Chopped Brush

Edwin Schaefer has proved that profitable use can be made of sandy brushland on his farm in the Cook Community northwest of Rising Star. Schaefer had 23 acres of brush chopped and planted to weeping lovegrass in March, 1957. A 28,000-pound brush-cutter pulled by a D-8 Caterpillar tractor with a grass seeding attachment was used to do the job. A good stand of grass came up in early April and was protected from grazing until the grass was established.

Schaefer questions the value of weeping lovegrass for grazing use. "I have found, however, that it is growing in late winter readily by cattle. He said, of course, its grazing use is limited from late spring on but we don't know of a grass that will do better on these deep sand sites."

Edwin and his father, Oscar, have developed 600 acres of sandy brushland for profitable grazing use in the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District. They have done this by bulldozing or cutting the brush and controlling the regrowth with goats.

Young Schaefer is planning to specialize in the production of registered Herford cattle. He has been developing his herd for the past two years. Both he and his cattle prefer weeping lovegrass over the grass bur.

**Eastland County
Calves Bring Top
Prices Monday**

FORT WORTH, July 7. — The highest price for mixed steer and heifer calves in some weeks was recorded in the livestock trade at Fort Worth Monday by good Eastland County calves. The 77 mixed calves weighed nearly 300 pounds at \$35 per hundred and were part of a shipment of 84 pairs of cows and calves consigned by W. H. Cooper of Eastland.

Cooper also had seven calves out at \$33. The 84 cows sold at \$18.25 with ten head out at \$17.

The sale accurately mirrors the strong demand for stockers in Texas and the Southwest, and recent rains have freshened pastures and supplemented stock water supplies, so that pastures in most of Texas are good now until late summer or early fall.

Trade on Monday reflected the short supplies and optimism of the livestock trade. Sales were strong to 25 or 50 cents higher in both cattle and sheep divisions.

Hogs were steady, as choice hogs topped at \$24.50 to \$24.75, and sows sold from \$21.50 downward. Feeder pigs drew \$18 to

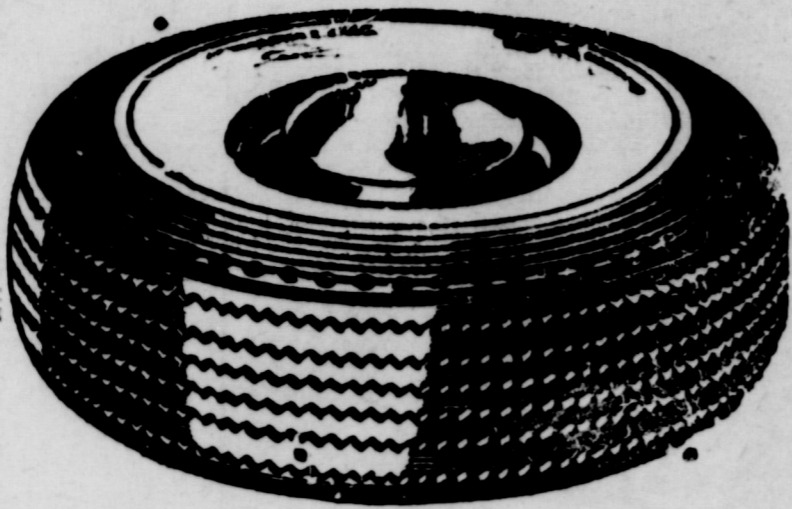

**Peach
 And Ice Cream
 Time In Texas**

However, in the past few years there has been a scarcity of peaches to go with our plentiful supply of ice cream, says the U. S. Department of Agriculture.
 Good news this year is that the largest peach crop since 1947 will move to market in July to team up with ice cream. This is why these foods are featured items on the July Plentiful Foods List.
 The forecast of the 1958 peach crop in the nine Southern States, which produce the bulk of the nation's early peaches, is 44 percent larger than the 1957 production, and also 53 percent above the 1947-56 average.
 Other foods considered in plentiful enough supply to rate spots on the July Plentiful List are watermelons, fresh and processed lemons, potatoes, summer vege-

tables and vegetable fats and oils.
 Among the summer vegetables expected to be in good supply are such items as sweet corn, tomatoes, cabbage, green beans, lettuce, cucumbers, green peppers and onions.
 USDA determines what foods are plentiful every month by a survey of the major food suppliers in this area.
