Continued from first page training under the Korean GI Bill. Is there a ceiling on what I can earn and still receive my VA allowance?

A - Yes. There is a \$310-amonth ceiling. When your com-b i n e d training allowance and earnings exceed that amount, VA will reduce your allowance accordingly.

Q — Two years ago I converted my GI term insurance to a per-manent plan policy. Please tell me how soon I can barrow on my permanent plan policy, and how much?

A - You can barrow on your permanent policy now, since it has been in force for more than one year. The amount you may barrow cannot exceed 94-percent of the cash reserve of your per-

Q — Can a paralyzed veteran who is eligible for a \$10,000 VA grant for a "wheelchair' home especially adapted for his needs especially adapted for his needs also get a GI home loan with which to pay off the rest of the cost of the house. A - Yes. The fact that he re-ceives a \$10,000 VA housing grant

does not deprive him of his right to the GI loan benefit.

Q — I will be going to school this fall, under the GI Bill. How soon do I get my first allowance check?

A - Under the law, VA allowance checks for training are payable only after the completion of each month of training, and the law allows VA 20 extra days to process checks. You should be prepared for a two-month wait before your first check comes.

Q — Is is possible for a dis-abled "peacetime" veteran to draw VA compensation at wartime rates?

A- Yes - if his disability resulted from extra-hazardous service, such as simulated warfare and the like.

Q - I will have to take a physical examination to reinstate my lapsed GI insurance policy. Who is supposed to mail my medical application for reinstatement to the VA, me or my physician?

A - Your examining physician should mail it to the VA as soon as your examination is completed.

Q - I named my mother as the beneficiary of my GI insurance policy, and indicated that the money be paid to her in a lump sum. Would she have the right

to change to some other i of payment if she desired A - Yes. She could cha

Q -- Does the fact that I m getting VA compensation for a disability incurred in Keysia automatically entitle me to ve-cational rehabilitation training? A -- No. The law requires that a disabled veteran be in most of training to overcome the indi-icap of his disability. If me were established in your case, you would be permitted to train Q -- I plan to sell my GI house and let the buyer take over my loan. If the VA grants me re-lief from liability, does that mean that GI loan entitlement will be stored? stored?

stored? A - No. Release from Hability does not mean that your entitle-ment will be restored. VA re-stores entitlement only under certain conditions, and then only when the loan is paid off so that VA is no longer liable on the curventee guarntee.
