CYMRIC

By United Press WASHINGTON, May 10 .- It is not believed that the American government will take any action in the torpedoing of the Cymric, although Consul Frost, located at Queenstown, has reported to the American government that the vessel was torpedoed without warning, and the crew imperiled in a rough sea. There were no Americans aboard the Cymric.

Germany dispatched a note to the American government today admitting the submarining of the Sussex. The German embassy stated that all reparation for the loss of the vessel would be made in due course of time.






