The report is made for the Interstate rules and regulations adopted January 1, 1913. The figures and other information given are taken from the records of the calender year 1915. A detailed statement of the revenues and expense of the company for the year is given together with data as to the mileage of pole lines and open wire in the entire plant of the company.

Immense Wire Mileage.

The report shows that the West Texas company has a total of 1 158 miles of pole lines, with 4,940 miles of wire in cables, and 3,668 miles of open wire. The number of local exchanges in the thirteen exchanges of the company last year—there are fiftten local exchanges this year—averaged 1, 250,310 per month, or about 40, 000 daily. The burden falls heaviest upon the smaller companies, having only one or two exchanges and a small wire mileage. The only question is as to how far the supervision of the Interstate Commission may go. The information given in our report will, we suppose, be used in compiling the statistical reports of the government, and this ac count much information has been demanded which is of little of no value except for statistical use.


