The United States is holding no Mexican war prisoners and the Mexican prisoners in this country are charged with crime that must be settled in the conrts.

That's another question, according to administration officials, who declare that the president is now interested solely in getting twentyfour American prisoners out of the Chihuahua prison.

Some believe that Carranza will yield and order the prisoners released. It is positively known that he at first intended releasing the prisers. The danger now lies in the possibility of Carranza asking that the United States "exchange prisoners." Should Carranza contend for this it would mean the immediate action for rescuing the Americans by force.
