County Orchard Field Day Set For March 6 In Carbon Section

Landowners Are Asked To Help In Spreading Quail

AUSTIN, Feb. 13. — A committee of members of the Game and Fish Commission will begin an early campaign to get more landowners to join in the state's quail rehabilitation program, according to the Assistant Secretary.

The committee is composed of Frank Wood, Wichita Falls; Robert Carr, San Angelo; Howard Carney, Atlanta; and J. W. Elliott, Mexia.

As a quail development committee, they will institute a program of interesting more landowners in providing cover and feed for quail. Nearly 35,000 bobwhites and some 10,000 cottontail quail were produced at that State Quail Hatchery at Tyler during 1957. They were sold to landowners at 50 cents each, about half the cost of production.

Landowners desiring birds should make their applications early to the Commission. Their land will be inspected and helpful information given as to cover condition requirements. No birds will be authorized for land that does not contain suitable cover and sufficient feed possibilities.

"The solution of the quail problem depends more upon the landowner than anything else," the Assistant Secretary said. "These birds require proper cover conditions, and assurance of a good food supply."

"Through efforts of Game Commission workers, thousands of Multiflora roses have been planted, along with such foods as partridge pea, dove weed, Kobe lespedeza and many other well-known varieties that produce seeds."

The development committee expects to make direct contact with landowners in an effort to get additional acreage made ready for this year's birds.

P. Broiles orchard, three miles southwest of Carbon. Insecticides, new varieties of adapted peaches, marketing, a spray program, pruning, plowing demonstration and use of native rootstocks for increasing grape yields will be discussed or demonstrated at the all-day meeting which has been an annual event among orchard men in the county for more than a decade.

Outstanding horticulturists from over the state invited to be on the program include T. E. Denman, Agriculture Experiment Station, and J. V. Laird, Tarleton State College, Stephenville; B. G. Hancock, A&M College Extension Service; J. W. Foster, Jr. Weatherford; and U. A. Randolph, Fruit Investigations Laboratory, Montague.

Peas On Plentiful List In February

Canned and frozen peas take the spotlight as the featured food on the U. S. Department of Agriculture's February plentiful foods list for this area, according to an announcement.

Here's why. The latest inventory of the Agricultural Marketing Service shows that stocks of canned green peas are 7 million cases larger than a year ago. Stocks of frozen peas run 16½ million pounds more than a year ago.

Other vegetables on the plentiful list are canned and frozen corn and potatoes. Growers' prices of potatoes are below those of last year in most western producing areas, while canned and frozen corn stocks are heavy enough to rate a spot on the list.

Since February usually marks the time when the fall pig crop starts to market, pork takes the featured spot at meat counters. The fall pig crop is 2% larger than last year.

Milk continues in heavy supply as production stands at record levels, increasing seasonally in February.

Apples and dried prunes are the only fruits listed as plentiful for February.

Other plentifuls include peanuts and peanut products and filberts.

USDA determines what's plentiful every month by a survey of major food suppliers in this area.

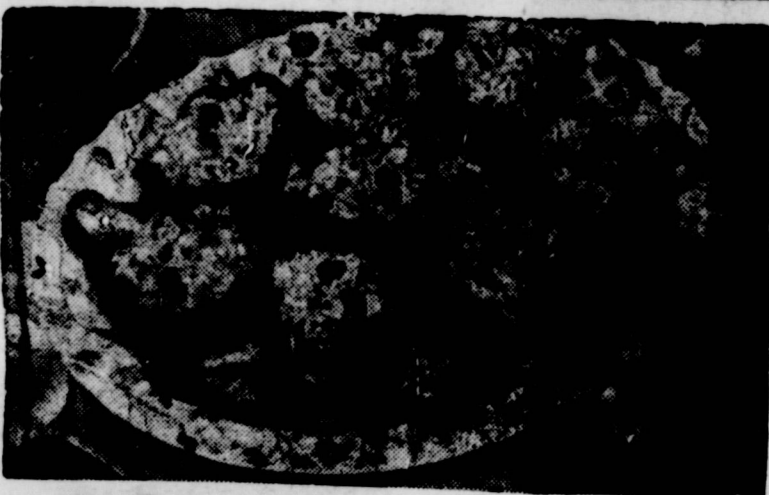

Curried Rice and Tuna Make a Tasty and Thrifty Filling for Luscious Tomatoes

INGREDIENTS:
8 medium sized ripe tomatoes
4 tablespoons minced onion
3 tablespoons minced green pepper
4 tablespoons butter or margarine
1, 7-ounce can tuna fish
2 cups cooked rice
1 teaspoon curry powder
¼ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon pepper
½ cup water

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2 quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this

low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off the heat. Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately.

For real convenience and economy of time and effort, keep unused rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Peel tomatoes easily by scalding, plunging into cold water and then peeling. Slice off stem end of tomatoes. Carefully scoop out pulp. Cook onion and green pepper in the butter or margarine until tender. Add the tuna fish, rice, curry powder, salt, pepper and water. Mix thoroughly. Fill the tomatoes with the tuna and rice mixture and bake at 350° F. about 15 minutes or until the tomatoes are tender. Serve hot. Garnish with green pepper rings if desired.

For a cool and refreshing salad, chill the tomatoes after they are stuffed and serve on salad greens. This recipe makes 8 servings or 3 cups of the curried tuna and rice mixture.

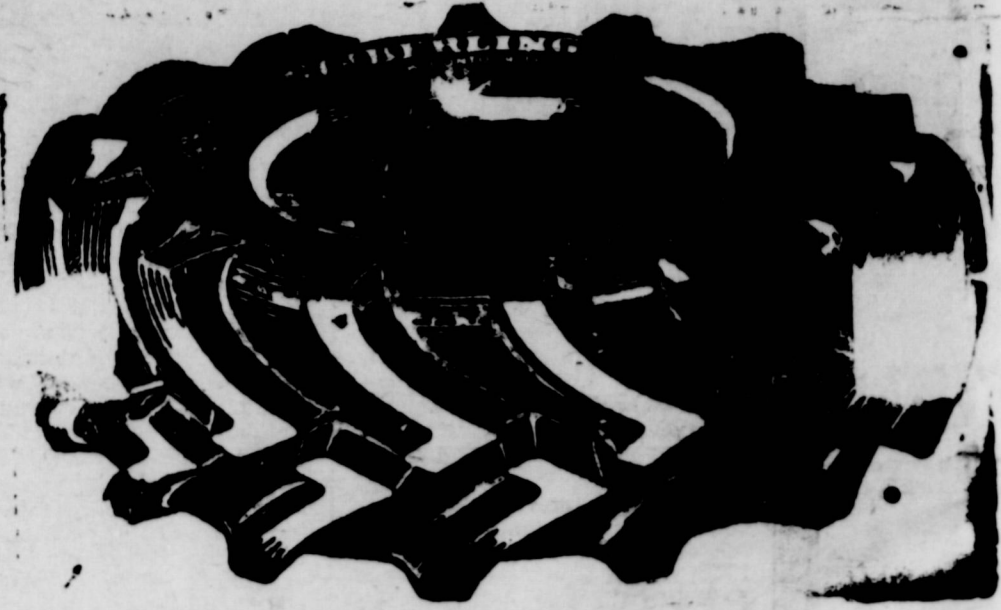

Raisin-Pecan Timbales With Hot Lemon Sauce

You'll want to show off these dessert timbales because they look so clever with the bits of toasted pecans and plump raisins in beautiful color contrast to the snowy white timbales. The lemon sauce is easy to make and oh, so pretty, served hot over the Raisin-Pecan Timbales.

RAISIN-PECAN TIMBALES WITH HOT LEMON SAUCE

Ingredients for Timbales:

- 2 cups water
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup uncooked white rice
- 1/2 cup beet or cane sugar
- 3/4 cup cooked raisins
- 3/4 cup coarsely chopped toasted pecans
- 1/4 pt. (1 cup) chilled whipping cream
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla

Ingredients for Lemon Sauce:

- 1 cup beet or cane sugar
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/4 cups boiling water
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- 2 teaspoons grated lemon rind

METHOD FOR MAKING TIMBALES: Put the water, salt and rice into a 2-quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible.

Cover and leave over this low heat for 14 minutes. Turn the heat off. Leave lid on for 10 minutes. Stir the sugar into the hot rice. Chill the rice. Fold in the raisins and the pecans. It is important that the pecans are toasted. Do this by placing the pecans on a greased shallow pan in a 350° oven for 10 minutes, or until browned. Whip the cream and stir in the vanilla. Fold the whipped cream into the chilled rice mixture.

Use a wet custard cup for molding the timbales. Press the rice into the custard cup and then unmold by running a knife around the edge of the custard cup and shaking out the timbales. Cover and store in the refrigerator until time to serve. To serve, garnish the top of each timbale with a toasted pecan and serve with the hot lemon sauce.

This recipe makes 6 timbales if a custard cup holding 2/3 of a cup is used for molding.

METHOD FOR MAKING THE LEMON SAUCE: Mix together the sugar, cornstarch and salt in a saucepan. Slowly stir in the boiling water. Cook over a medium heat stirring constantly, until clear and thick. Stir in the lemon juice and lemon rind. If desired, color with yellow food coloring. Serve hot over the Raisin-Pecan Timbales.

EASTLAND COUNTY COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION HOLDS MEETING

Members of the Eastland County Hale-Aiken school study committee reported some definite steps forward at their Thursday afternoon meeting in Eastland.

The Teachers Supply Committee, headed by Floyd Killingsworth of Ranger, with Mrs. Maurine Shell of Gorman as secretary, voted to conduct a county-wide survey of junior and senior classes to determine how many students plan to enter the teaching profession.

The School Program Committee, with Wendall Siebert of Eastland as chairman and G. B. Rush of Ranger as secretary, termed health and physical education as this county's greatest school weakness. A study of the PE situation in the county, in addition to the rest of the school program, is to be made.

Members of the Finance Committee pondered ways of meeting the rising cost of education. A study of local financing is to be made. Tom Wilson of Eastland heads the committee and Wilson Guest of Ranger is secretary.

The School Construction Committee decided that representatives of each school district should make a survey to determine how the county now stands as far as number of students compared with number of class rooms available. Chairman of the committee is W. C. Browning of Gorman. Mrs. M. A. Treadwell of Eastland is secretary.

The four committees met separately in Eastland High School classrooms. Next meeting of the group will be held the last week in February and a meeting open to the general public is slated for early March, according to Mrs.

Joseph M. Perkins of Eastland, county chairman. Secretary of the county group is Mrs. Richard Donovan of Cisco. H. R. Garrett, county school superintendent, is consultant to the committee and Virgil E. Moore of Eastland is publicity chairman.

All members of the committee, including representatives of Carbon, Cisco, Eastland, Gorman, Olden, Rising Star, Ranger, Scranton and Desdemona districts, were presented with 37-page guide books prepared by the Hale-Aiken Committee of Twenty-four. That committee was appointed by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives and the State Board of Education, each naming six members. Included in the state committee membership is Sen. Floyd Bradshaw who represents Eastland County in the Texas Senate.

Mrs. Perkins explained the work of the committee, saying, "In authorizing this study, the Legislature continued a pattern which has been used effectively in Texas for many years. Since the formation of the Gilmer-Aiken study committee in 1947, Texas citizens have had many opportunities to participate in state-wide conferences and studies aimed at school appraisal and improvement. The Hale-Aiken studies to be conducted in each of the 254 counties this year will enable all interested citizens to become well informed concerning the work and the problems of their schools, and to assist in providing for Texas children the best schools to be found anywhere."
