Nov. . 13 .- The British admiralty has requistioned all liners in the Gulf and Atlantic trade which are flying the British flag, by ordering all such to carry fifty per cent grain, ac-cording to advices received by British ships here today. The new requirements, together with metal requirements, already in force, practically loads the ships to their marks, making it impossible for them to carry cotton or general

Heretofore. the. British. ships have been required to carry onethird grain, and this made it easy for part of the cargo to consist of cotton. All British tonnage here has been withdrawn from the market, and it is understood the order extends to vessels sailing from all United States ports.

Until he can secure a home and establish headquarters, Mrs. Rives and children will remain in Ballinger.






