## Allotments For New Growers To Be Made By ASC

Eastland County ASC is now accepting applications for new grower cotton and peanut allotments, according to an announcement by Emmett E. Powell, county office manager.

"To be eligible for an allotment the owner or operator must not be interested in any other allotments farms, must depend on the farm for his living, and in the case of peanuts, the operator must have had two years experience out of the past five years in growing peanuts," Mr. Powell said.

Growers who are not going to plant cotton or peanut allotments in 1958 may release the acreage to the county committee for reapportionment to other producers. The closing date for peanut applications was announced to be February 7, 1958, and the closing date for cotton, February 22, 1958.

## Value Of Terraces And Contour Farming Told By SCS Workers

(Editor's Note: This is another article by Upper Leon Soil Conservation Personnel on the value of the soil building program.)

Terraces are regarded by many landowners as a vital part of conservation farming. The terracing need of the county is great as based on soils information to soil, slope and amount of erosion. Some 1600 miles of terraces remain to be done by landowners.

Terraces and contour cultivation supported by a good vegetative program prove highly effective in holding maximum soil and water in place for continued crop production and soil improvement. Terraces also are very beneficial in carrying surplus water slowly to protected outlets. Terrace outlets must be stable, if the terrace system is to function properly without severe damage. Native grass land make excellent outlets, in some instances outlets are not available onto pasture and waterways must be established along natural drains prior to terrace construction.

The all time record rainfall for 1957 has convinced many landowners of the immediate need for a terrace system on their cropland. Several excessive rains of high intensity did a great deal of damage in the form of gully and sheet erosion resulting in excessive soil and moisture losses. Cropland with terraces and Cover Crops had a very minimum loss of soil and moisture during the heavy rains and by contrast fields without terraces and cover crops suffered the maximum damage.

Landowners growing row crops must do needed terracing

between harvest time in the fall and planting time in the spring. Now is an ideal time for these men to terrace. Small grain farmers normally do their terracing during the summer and early fall after small grains have been harvested. Since this practice is seasonal with most landowners it becomes very important to take necessary action during such periods of time.

Soil Conservation Service Technicians assisting supervisors of the local Soil Conservation Districts are available to (1) Assist landowners in the planning and laying out of terrace systems, (2) Give necessary supervision during terrace construction, (3) Check completed terraces to determine that each terrace meets all specifications which insures its functioning properly.

If the landowner has requested cost share on the practice from the ASC County Committee then the total amount of terraces constructed are certified for payment. The Eastland County ASC Committee has a cost share payment of \$2.50 per 100 feet of completed terraces and also share the cost of shaping and seeding of waterways.

Landowners in need of these practices are encouraged to contact their ASC Committee, local Soil Conservation Service technicians or the District Supervisors in their area. Terracing is timely and for many landowners now is the time.
