The remains of the calf were recovered from the ruins and buried with Masonic honors, Mrs. Morgan claiming that her husband was a Mason, and the fellow Masons made up a purse of \$600 and presented to Mrs. Morgan before it developed that Morgan was carrying \$10,000 life insurance. The insurance company became suspicious when they went to secure proof of the death and the 'man's' bones were exhumed and found to be a calf's bones, and later the man was arrested at Sweetwater. and given a speedy trial.

Powell, mayor as aforesaid, do hereby give notice by posting at three public places in said city of Ballinger, and by publishing this notice in The Daily Ledger, a newspaper pub-lished in said City of Ballnger, that an election will be held with in said city on the 10th day of January, A. D. 1917, being on a Wednesday, to determine whether or not the commission form of government shall be adopted in said City of Ballinger. At said election there shall also be two commissioners elected for said city, to serve until the first Tuesday in April, 1917. The poling place for said election will be at the City Hall in said City of Ballinger.






