



It seems that the exception made in the law, allowing parties living on the outskirts of the city, and those who had a pretty good block of land to themselves, has caused the law to become a dead letter. At a recent meeting of the council, the law was amended making it unlawful to keep hogs in the city under any condition, and the city authorities are very positive in the state ment that this law will be enforc-

"I as mayor will see that this law is carried out," said Mayor Powell Friday morning, 'and I will not wait for some one to make complaint, but will personally see that this city is free from hogs. There will be no excuses accepted, no extension of time and no evasion of the law, as we have given ample notice and the citizens have had time to get rid of their hogs."






