### GI Insurance Is Costly To Vets Of World War I

World War II veterans holding term GI insurance might do well to ponder the experience of nearly 20,000 veterans of World War I who didn't convert their term policies to permanent GI insurance.

That's the advice of Scott B. Harrington, manager of the Veterans Administration office in Dallas, Texas.

Term GI insurance, he explained, must be renewed every five years at an increasing higher premium rate.

Having carried their term GI policies through as many as seven renewals, these 20,000 World War I veterans now face an almost insoluble problem, Mr. Harrington said.

Averaging 62 years of age, with their earnings generally declining, they are finding the renewal cost of their term policies so high that many of them are being forced to drop their GI insurance. Even those who can afford to renew currently may not be able to do so in another five years, Mr. Harrington pointed out.

He said that World War II veterans can avoid the dilemma of their older comrades by converting to permanent GI insurance. Insurance is higher than term, but the premium rates do not increase as rapidly as term rates.

Mr. Harrington explained that permanent GI insurance provides a fixed premium rate, and the policyholder can avoid the increasing cost of term insurance.

GI insurance policies are available at the VA office in Dallas, Texas.

## Senate Confirms Jackson As State Veterans Official

The Texas Senate has confirmed Governor Price Daniel's appointment of E. L. Jackson of Cisco to the State Veterans Affairs Commission, according to information here Saturday. Mr. Jackson appeared before the Senate's committee on appointments last Thursday and the Senate voted its approval Friday.

Mr. Jackson was appointed to serve a six-year term ending June 12, 1963. At the Commission's recent meeting, the Ciscoan was elected to serve as chairman. The Commission holds regular quarterly meetings and is subject to call for other meetings.

## Farm Employers Are Reminded To Make SS Reports

Employers of farm workers were reminded today of their responsibilities under the provisions of the Social Security Act by C. M. Vaden, Jr., field representative of the Abilene Social Security office.

Anyone who is employed to do farm work is covered by the social security law if he: (1) receives wages of \$150 or more from any agricultural employer in a year, or (2) works on 20 or more days in a year where his wages are figured on a time basis such as by the hour, or the day, rather than on a piece-work basis such as by the row, or the hundred pounds.

According to Vaden, the crew leader who furnishes and pays the workers in his crew is always the employer, unless the farmer and the crew leader have agreed in writing that the crew leader is the farmer's employee. When there is such a written agreement, the members of the crew, as well as the crew leader, are the farmer's employees.

The employer of farm workers should: (1) keep a record of each worker's name, social security number, and the amount each one earns, and (2) arrange to pay the social security tax of 4 1/2% of the total covered wages; one half the taxes may be deducted from the worker's pay. The taxes are payable to the Director of Internal Revenue in January of each year, which are filed by crew leaders and farm operators that workers receive credit for their earnings.

"It is from these annual reports these wage credits are the basis for a worker's retirement income

in his older years, or income to his family in the event of his death," Vaden explained.

Crew leaders, farmers, and their hired workers may get social security numbers or information about the insurance from the Abilene Social Security office. Additional information about social security taxes may be obtained from the Director of Internal Revenue.

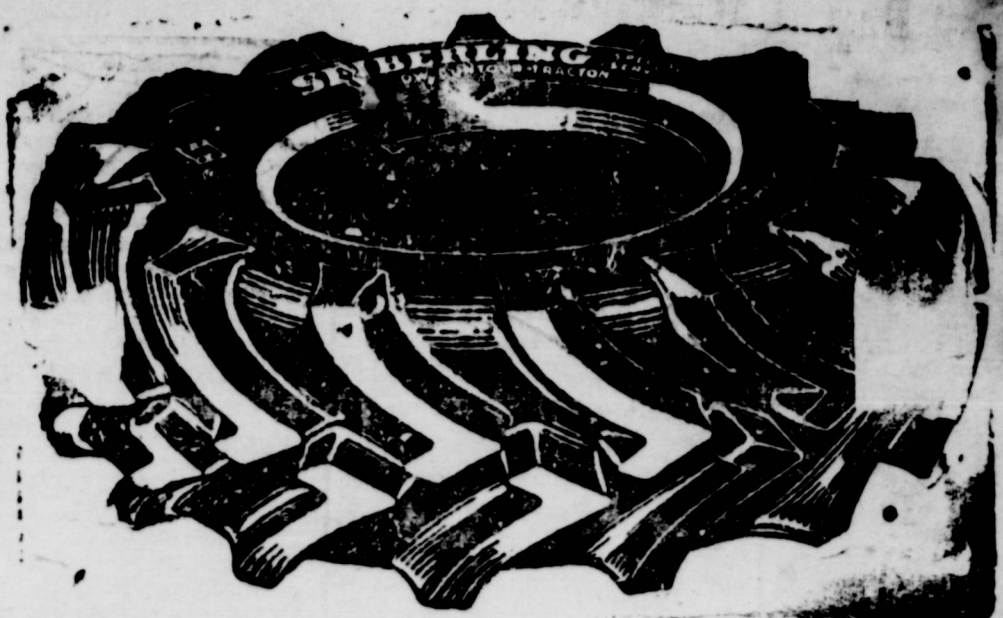

you hold in your hand. If you stood and watched that bee visiting a flower every second, day and night, you would have to watch for 23 days. But we haven't allowed time for the bee to go back and forth to the hive. Average flight of bees gathering nectar is 3 miles, although some bees go as far as 5 miles from the hive. ## Home Makers News and Views

Good nutrition is so important during these weeks when so much sickness is in our communities. The meals you homemakers serve should be packed with proteins, minerals and vitamins. Much of these foodstuffs is found in dairy products such as cheese, butter, and milk. Since time is an important element to many of you homemakers, most of the suggested recipes given for dairy food products are simple to prepare.

Whole-meal sandwiches are quickies for lunch. Try this triple decker open-face. Toast one side of bread. Spread untoasted side with butter. Add a spoonful of baked beans, cover with a slice of Cheddar cheese and top with a thin sliced onion. Place the sandwich under the broiler until the cheese melts.

**VEGETABLES DISHES WITH DAIRY PRODUCTS** — Start with butter — just butter. Salt and pepper can do wonders for any vegetable. In combination with other seasonings, as savory, basil, or caraway, butter really comes into its own.

**CHEESE IN CANDY** — Add nutrition to your sweets this way:  
 1 3-oz. pkg. cream cheese  
 2 C sifted confectioners' sugar  
 2 1-oz. squares unsweetened chocolate, melted  
 1/4 t. vanilla  
 Dash of salt  
 1/2 C. chopped pecans  
 Cream the cheese, blend sugar into it slowly, add chocolate, and mix well. Add vanilla, salt, and pecans and mix. Press into a greased shallow pan. Place in refrigerator until firm, then cut into squares.

**NUTRITION AND SNACKS DO MIX** — Make sandwiches of your favorite date-nut bread and cream cheese.

**FOR PARTY-TIME** make a tangy egg nog. Beat 1 egg, blend in 2 C milk (whole or made from milk solids), 1 C orange juice, and 1 C ginger ale. Serves 4.
