GI Insurance Is Costly To Vets Of World War I

World War II, veterans holding term GI insurance might do well to ponder the experience of nearly 20,000 veterans of World War I who didn't convert their term policies to permanent GI insurance.

That's the advice of Scott B. Harrington, manager of the Vet-Administration office in erans Dallas, Texas.


Term GI insurance, he explained, must be renewed every five years at an increasing higher premium rate.

Having carried their term GI policies through as many as seven renewals, these 20,000 World War veterans now face an aimost insoloble problem, Mr. Harrington said.

Averaging 62 years of age, with their earnings generally declining, they are finding the renewal cost of their term policies so high that many of them are being forced to drop their GI insurance. Even those who can afford to renew currently may not be able to do to in another five years, Mr. Har-

Farm Employers Are Reminded To Make SS Reports

Employers of farm workers were reminded today of their responsibilities under the provisions of the Social Security Act by C. M. Vaden, Jr., field representative of the Abilene Social Security office.

Anyone who is employed to do farm work is covered by the social security law if he: (1) receives wages of \$150 or more from any agricultural employer in a year, or (2) works on 20 or more days in a year where his wages are figured on a time basis such as by the hour, or the day, rather than on a piece-work basis such as by the row, or the hundred pounds.

According to Vaden, the crew leader who furnishes and pays the workers in his crew is always the employer, unless the farmer and the crew leader have agreed in writing that the crew leader is the farmer's employee. When there is such a written agreement, the members of the crew, as well as the crew leader, are the farmer's employees.

The employer of farm workers should: (1) keep a record of each worker's name, social security number, and the amount each one earns, and (2) arrange to pay the social security tax of 4½% of the total covered wages; one half the taxes may be deducted from the worker's pay. The taxes are payable to the Director of Internal Revenue in January of each year, which are filed by crew leaders and farm operators that workers "It is from these annual reports

receive credit for their earnings. These wage credits are the basis for a worker's retirement income in his older years, or income to his family in the event of his death," Vaden explained. Crew leaders, farmers, and

their hired workers may get social security numbers or information about the insurance from the Abilene Social Security office. Additional information about social security taxes may be obtained from the Director of Internal Revenue.





you hold in your hand. If you stood and watched that bee visiting a flower every second, day and night, you would have to watch for 23 days. But we haven't allowed time for the bee to go back and forth to the hive. Average flight of bees gathering nectar is 3 miles, although some bees go as far as 5 miles from the hive. Figuring the average flight, the bee must travel 75,000 miles to get enough honey to fill your jar.

But the poor, overworked bee can't stand the strain, and during the working season her life span is only 3 weeks. Fortunately, there are 50,000 other bees in a colony and back home at the hive, their little sisters are hatching at the rate of 2,000 a day. The combined efforts of a colony can produce as much as 300 pounds and more of honey in a single season.




