Hollweg's resignation was predicted several days ago, but in a speech before the reichstag Tuesday he declared that he felt it his duty to remain chancellor of Germany for the protection of the fatherland.

GALVESTON, Tex., July 12 .-Just in the nick of time a watchman on Galveston's two million dollar causeway picked up a lighted bomb and threw it into the bay. The watchman found the bomb with the fuse slowly burning just after a north bound M. K. & T. freight train had passed over the causeway, and it is believed the bomb was thrown from the train and a plot had been formed to wreck the causeway and tie up traffic. The train was stopped by telephone messages sent ahead after it had reached main land and one man was taken from the train and is being held by the officers. A thorough investigation is being made and other arrest may follow.

The bomb would have wrecked the causeway within a few seconds if the watchman had not happened on the scene at the time




