Briefly this is the plan: The men called for service will receive two more notices. The local board will notify them when the district board has passed on their appeals. this notice will inform them wheth er the district board rejected their appeal and certified them back to the local board as being subject to call for duty, and if certified the man so certified will be instructed to hold himself in readiness to re-

The second and last notice will be mobilization orders. This notice will instruct him when to reand the law provides that all men called for mobilization must be here within twelve hours at the least of time for entraining, and all who report within twenty-four hours of time of entraining will be kept here at the expense of the gov ernment, board and lodging being provided for the men drafted until the time for entraining.


