The results of the grand jury's inrestigations were announced to he court Tuesday morning and Tuesday afternoon Judge James Cornell, on his own motion, transferred the case to Coleman county. When the indictment of the grand jury was read to the defendant in the court room this afternoon he entered a plea of not guilty and Judge Cornell announced the change of venue.

# A Letter From Washington

The Food Administrator Writes Us:

"The use of baking powder breads made of corn and other coarse flours instead of patent wheat flour is recommended by the Conservation Division of the Food Administration. The wheat needed for export is thus conserved, and at the same time healthful food for our own people is provided. The circulation of recipes providing for these uses would be of assistance in carrying out our plans."

The following recipes for Corn Bread and Rye Rolls save wheat flour

BAKING POWDER

1% cups cern meal
2 cup flour
4 level teaspoons Dr. Price's Baking Powder
1 tablespoon sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1% cups milk
2 tablespoons shortening
Mix thoroughly dry ingredients; add milk and melted shortening; beat well; pour into well greased pan and bake in hot oven about 25 minutes.

2 cups rye flour

½ teaspoon salt

3 level teaspoons Dr. Price's Baking Powden

½ tablespoon shortening

½ tablespoon shortening

Sift dry ingredients together, add milk and melted shortening. Knead on floured board; shape into rolls.




