200 Teachers Are Working In County

Approximately 200 teachers were employed in schools in Eastland County during the 1956-57 school term, it was reported recently in a survey by County School Superintendent H. R. (Pop) Garrett. Mr. Garrett supervises all schools in the county with less than 500 students and assists in the work of the three independent school districts.

Schools under the supervision of Mr. Garrett include Olden, Desdemona, and Scranton districts with approximately 100 students each; Carbon, 185 students; Rising Star and Gorman, 250 students each.

Cisco is the largest independent school district in the county with 1150 students, Mr. Garrett stated. Ranger is second with 800, and Eastland is third with about 700 enrolled annually, he said.

NUMBER ONE ON THE BALLOT

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 5, 1957.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 27 proposing an amendment to Subsection (a) of Section 62, Article XVI of the Constitution of Texas, relating to establishment of a retirement, disability and death compensation fund for officers and employees of the State, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Subsection (a) of Section 62, Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as to read hereafter as follows:

"Section 62. (a) The Legislature shall have the authority to levy taxes to provide a State Retirement, Disability and Death Compensation Fund for the officers and employees of the State, and may make such reasonable inclusions, exclusions, or classifications of officers and employees of this State as it deems advisable. The Legislature may also include officers and employees of judicial districts of the State who are or have been compensated in whole or in part directly or indirectly by the State, and may make such other reasonable inclusions, exclusions, or classifications of officers and employees of judicial districts of this State as it deems advisable. Persons participating in a retirement system created pursuant to Section 1-a of Article V of this Constitution shall not be eligible to participate in the Fund authorized in this Subsection, and persons participating in a retirement system created pursuant to Section 48-a of Article III of this Constitution shall not be eligible to participate in the Fund authorized in this Subsection except as permitted by Section 63 of Article XVI of this Constitution. Provided, however, any officer or employee of a county as provided for in Article XVI, Section 62, Subsection (b) of this Constitution, shall not be eligible to participate in the Fund authorized in this Subsection, except as otherwise provided herein.

The amount contributed by the State to such Fund shall equal the amount paid for the same purpose from the income of each such person, and shall not exceed at any time five per centum (5%) of the compensation paid to each such person by the State.

"All funds provided from the compensation of such person or by the State of Texas for such Retirement, Disability and Death Compensation Fund, as are received by the Treasury of the State of Texas, shall be invested in bonds of the United States, or in bonds issued by any agency of the United States Government, the payment of the principal of and interest on which is guaranteed by the United States, or in such other securities as are now or hereafter may be permitted by law as investments for the Permanent University Fund or for the Permanent School Fund of this State, under the same limitations and restrictions imposed by the Constitution for investment of those funds and subject to such regulations as the Legislature may provide. However, a sufficient amount of said Fund shall be kept on hand to meet the immediate payment of the amount likely to become due each year out of said Fund, such amount of funds to be kept on hand to be determined by the agency which may be provided by law to administer said Fund.

"Should the Legislature enact enabling laws in anticipation of the adoption of this Amendment, such legislation shall not be invalid by reason of its anticipatory character."

Sec 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at a special election to be held throughout the State on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1957, at which election all ballots shall have printed thereon the following:

"FOR the Constitutional Amendment amending Subsection (a) of Section 62, Article XVI of the State Constitution, relating to establishment of a retirement, disability and death compensation fund for officers and employees of the State."

"AGAINST the Constitutional Amendment amending Subsection (a) of Section 62, Article XVI of the State Constitution, relating to establishment of a retirement, disability and death compensation fund for officers and employees of the State."

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for said special election and this Amendment shall be published and the election held as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.

Good Progress Is Reported In Restocking Native Range Grass

Good progress is being made in "restocking" the ranges with grass this summer it was reported this week by Soil Conservation District workers. Soil soaking rains in April and May gave land owners their best opportunity in years of bringing the better grasses back to their range land. After the heavy rain was over in May some ranges with extra good cover were soaked over ten feet deep. Even those with only light cover were wet about five feet.

have taken advantage of this moisture in unusually prolific growth. Shallow rooted spring grasses such as Texas grama and annual ryegrass have made little more than their normal growth, but cover shaded in many places with weeds. Shallow rooted grasses have also suffered somewhat from a lack of rain in June and July.

Weed growth has been tremendous this summer, particularly broom weed and sneeze weeds, on almost all rangeland. While most weeds have little grazing value, many times they may be taken as an indication of progress in range improvement. Weeds usually cover bare ground and improve soil condition for future grass growth.

Prospects look good for a badly needed grass seed crop this fall on the ranges. Little bluestem and Indian grass has already begun to boot, and Side oats grama is already seeding in many pastures. A good rain in the near future would do much toward insuring a seed crop. Range deferment is considered essential while seed is being made for natural reseeding of native range. Even a few animals in a pasture will almost always top all the seed heads of most good grasses while they are in the soft dough stage.

Installation of conservation structures is proceeding at a fair rate this summer. Ponds have been recently built by J. E. McDaniel at Carbon, Owen Hamilton on the Mary Coffman place south of Ranger, Raymond Penn four miles west of Cisco, Walter Underwood near Alameda, W. E. Kurklin between Cisco and Eastland, and Dean Perry on his farm west of Cisco.
