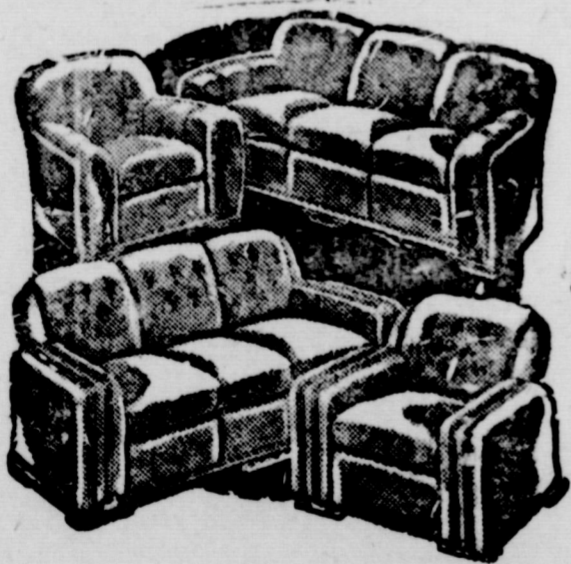

### Official Reports Lone Cedar Club Fully Subscribed

Dr. James Whittington, president, has announced that the Lone Cedar Country Club's land company has been fully subscribed with a total of 225 members being accepted as a campaign ended June 30. Plans call for a country club to be built by the company at Lake Leon.

Organization of the land company, Dr. Whittington said, was the first step in forming the new club. Plans for the club include a modern club house, a swimming pool, roads and fences, an 18-hole golf course, and other features.

Work on the roads and fences will begin not later than August 1, Dr. Whittington said. The club's land is located on the north shore of the lake. A meeting of the board of directors is expected to be held in the near future to discuss plans for the country club.

**UPPER LEON SCS SUPERVISORS  
 PLAN MEETING AT RISING STAR**

The Board of Supervisors of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District have announced that a July 16 board meeting will be held at Rising Star. De Leon is the official headquarters of the District and their regular meeting place but the board members like to meet in all the towns and cities within the District once a year, it was pointed out.

An all day session which will be held at Rising Star will be devoted to the discussion of their problems during the period. The Rising Star will have local teachers and business people an opportunity to meet with the Board and discuss problems relating to the conservation of the soil and water resources of the area.

B. B. Hickman, who farms and ranches 4 miles west of Rising Star, is chairman of the board. He invited all people having an interest in this meeting to attend.

The Brown-Mills Soil Conservation District bought 100 lbs. of Blackwell switchgrass seed from Guyle Greynolds this week. The seed will be turned over to the Soil Conservation Service and used to sow emergency spillways and dams of the flood prevention structures constructed in the Clear Creek Watershed of Brown County.

Greynolds produced the grass seed last year on his farm 3 miles south of Rising Star. He expects to harvest 3,000 lbs. of the grass seed this year. He planted 10 acres of the switchgrass in April, 1956.
