WAR BOARD NAMES NON-ESSENTIALS

San Angelo, Sept. 9-Non-essen tial industeries for the Seventeeth Texas district, which consists of Tom Green Coke Concho, Crockett, Irion, Menard, Pecos, Reagan, Runnels, Scheicher, Stearling and Upton counties, were designated at a meeting of the community war labor board at the office of the federal employment bureau in the St. Angelus hotel building, Friday evening, and men who are in the classes that were named will now come under General Crowder's celebrated "work or fight'

The order applies principally to porters, janitors and other unskilled laborers and is not intended, it is stated, to disrupt any business. Skilled workmen are not affected for the most part, and there is no objection to the employment of women or of men over forty-five or under eighteen for the places that are wacated.

Those who are affected by the order are expected to register with the employment that is suited to their likings.


