Paris, oct. 30.—The French war office announces officially today that the Italians have taken 25, 000 prisoners and more than 200 guns in the present offensive.

Rome, Oct. 30 .- The allies continue to vigerously press forward and have advanced within the last day's fighting seven miles beyond the Piave river along a front of twenty-five miles, the war office officially announces. In the last day's drive they have captured nine additional villages.

With the Italian Army, Oct. 30 The Italians and British are com pletely piercing the Austrian resistance lines and are advancing rapidly eastward between the two railways. The allies moved their troops in such way as to fool the Austrians on the Pivae front, and have cut all lines of communication on the Venetian Plains.

Washington, Oct. 30-Germany has sent another note to the Amer ican government. The note received today is supplementary to the communication received Monday on the subject of peace.

The new message describes what Germany is doing in the way of establishing a constitutional government and making charges to comply with the demands of the United States. According to the supplementary message the German government is taking steps to make her government responsible to the people, for the people and by the people, etc.







INFLUENZA DEATH RATE LOW IN TEXAS

The people of this country have been somewhat alarmed over the influenza epidemic, and well they should to the extent of using every precaution to stamp out the disease, but when we compare our los es with those of northern and eastern cities and states, we have just cause to feel thankful.

The state board of health announces that the death rate in Tex as from influenza has been less than five per cent, while in the north and east it has run as high as 100.2 per thousand cases. The thousand. In Lowell, Mass., the creased from 12.7 to 83. In the state of Texas the rate has not exceeded 5 deaths out of 1000 cases

Due to sanitary conditions and climatic conditions the death rate in some Texas cities has been greater than in others. Some cities and towns have almost escapeed the disease entirely, while others have suffered heavily.
