# BY TANK EXPLOSION

San Angelo, Nov. 21.-An explosion of a fifty gallon steel drum at the Orient roundhouse Tuesday afternoon shortly before three o'clock instantly killed Juan Arambula, a Mexican employe.

Arambula's head was cut almost entirely in half, the steel that inflicted the death blow striking him over the right ear. It passed through the skull with an upward tilt and severed it as evenly as a sharp blade would have done. The top of the man's head was found several feet away. There were few other injuries to the body.

The drum head of the barrel was picked up about 200 feet away while the rim was found still further. A Mexican helper standing near was badly jarred by the force of the explosion but was not se-




