Copenhagen, Dec. 7 .-- A note has been received in Denmark from Germany, declaring that Ger many is on the verge of famine. The note says that the present ger. Most of the forty men who food supply in Germany is only one third of the normal supply, and that Austria has less than a month's supply.

HEAVEST CASUALTY LIST YET REPORTED

The following casualties are reported by the Commanding General of the American Expeditionary Forces: Killed in action 406, died of wounds, 173, died of ac cident and other causes, 7; died of airplane accident, 3; died of disease 260; wounded severely, 1,918; wounded degree undertermined. 227; wounded slightly, 556; missing in action, 285; total 3,835.

Total number of casualties to date: Killed in action (including 396 at sea) 23,431; died of wounds 9,091; died of disease 12,993; died of aecident and other causes 1,888, wounded in action 56,764; missing in action (including prisoners) 12-656; total to date, 116,823.
