

Paris, May 23 .- The Allies will take no steps towards measures for punishing the former Kaiser until the treaty of peace has been signed and ratified, it was afficialy learned today. After the treaty has been signed it is expected that the Kaiser will be brought to trial before an international court created for that purpose.






