The plaintiffs in the case allege that they were in service at the time the notes came due, and that under the law suit could not be brought until they were discharged and returned to civil life, and that defendant Neves violated this law in filing suit against them to recover title to property which they purchased from him.

The plaintiffs pray in their petition that they have damage to the amount of \$15,000 and \$1,000 additional damage for the use of the property during the year 1919. They also ask the court to set aside the judgment against them and that the title to the property be transferred back to them.






