Eastland County farmers approved marketing quotas for peanuts and cotton crops in a referendum held Tuesday, December 11, according to reports from the County Agricultural Stabili-zation and Conservation Committee.

Peanut And Cotton Marketing

The peanut marketing quotas, which will be in effect for the next three years, were approved with 236 for and 18 against. Voters approved the cotton quotas by a margin of 95 to 8. The cotton quotas will be in effect only one year.

The referendum for the Cisco area was held in the Cisco Chamber of Commerce by Walter Kurklin, M. M. Parmer, and B. O. Speegle. In the cotton referendum, local voters approved the measure with 11 for and 2 against. The peanut quota was approved with 37 votes for and against at the local voting place.

The acreege allotment for 1957crop peanuts in Texas is 355,063 acres, the same as for the 1956 crop, according to Robert G. Shrauner, chairman of the Texas ASC. The 1957 state allotment has been apportioned among farms on the basis of the past acreage of peanuts; abnormal conditions affecting acreage; land, labor and equipment available for the production of p nuts; crop-rotation practices and soil and other physical factors affecting the production of peanuts.

The marketing quota for the farm is the actual production of the farm allotment. The quotas with penalties on "excess" peanuts will be in effect and price supports will be available to cooperators at the full level of the available support -- 75 to 90 per cent of parity under the plan approved in the referendum. The penalties will apply to growers who exceed their acreage allotments.


