## MEXICAN CHIEF SAYS VILLA WHIPPED; ACT AGAINST DIAZ

Galveston, Aug. 8.—The Villa revolutionary movement in northern Mexico has been completely broken, according to official statements of General Barragan, the Mexican Chief of Staff, who telegraphed to the Mexican Consul's office here today.

The Mexican government now plans to take immediate action against bandits Diaz and Pelaez, near Tampico, General Barragan said in his message to the consul here.

Washington, Aug. 8.—The Senate today ordered immediate investigation of the killing of Americans in Mexico and the confiscation and damage to American property.

## NO PINK BOLL WORMS HERE

H. C. Cripp, representing the department of agriculture, spent two or three days here this week inspecting cotton fields, where it had been reported that worms were working. In one field a worm resembling the pink boll worm in some respects, was doing a little damage, and Farm Agent Eaton, assisted by Mr. Cripp made a thorough investigation.

"Very little damage is being done," said Mr. Cripp, "and the pest is nothing more nor less than the common boll worm." The wormologist stated that there was no sign of pink boll worms here and no cause for alarm. The common boll worm is working only in the low lands in a few places, and the hot dry weather is putting that pest out of business. Cotton is in a thriving condition and many fields bid fair to make a bale per acre.

It will be recalled that a car of seed was shipped here last spring from the pink boll worm district, and the government sent men here to trace down the seed and keep them off the farm as soon as it was discovered that the seed came from a district where the worm had been discovered.

## QUEER MARRIAGE LAWS IN AMERICA

In advertising the picture program for The Queen tonight, some queer marriage laws from different states are given. The title of the picture to be shown tonight is: "Why I Would Not Marry," and the play is reproduced from one of William Fox's morality plays, showing how an attempt to force a beautiful young girl into marriage against her will.

In Pennsylvania a statute provides that all marriages shall be solemnized before twelve witnesses, but marriages not so celebrated have nevertheless been held valid.

The common law constitutes, a complete marriage, in any State, but conditions, however, may be imposed by the various State legislatures.

In New Hampshire, where the statutes provides that none but ministers may solemnize marriages, common law marriages without justice or minister have been held valid.

In Massachusetts, a marriage by mutual agreement, not in accordance with the statutes, has been held void.

The prohibition of marriage with a deceased wife's sister has been abolished throughout the United States.

Marriages between cousins of first blood is forbidden in New Hampshire, Ohio, Indiana, Kansas, Nevada, Washington, North and South Dakota, Montana, Louisiana, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Nebraska, Utah and Wisconsin.

Virginia forbids the marriage of a woman with the husband of her brother's or sister's daughter.

New Jersey prohibits the marriage of any person who has been confined in a public asylum without a certificate of complete recovery signed by two physicians.

Michigan is the one State in the Union which prohibits the marriage of any one who has suffered from disease and has not been cured.

All our marriage and divorce laws all our statutes on the subject, in so far as they pertain to localities, embrace within the limits of particular States, are State laws, the national power with us not having legislative or judicial cognizance of the matter within those localities. Thus it happens that one State may recognize a couple as married, whereas, if they moved to another State, they would not be married.

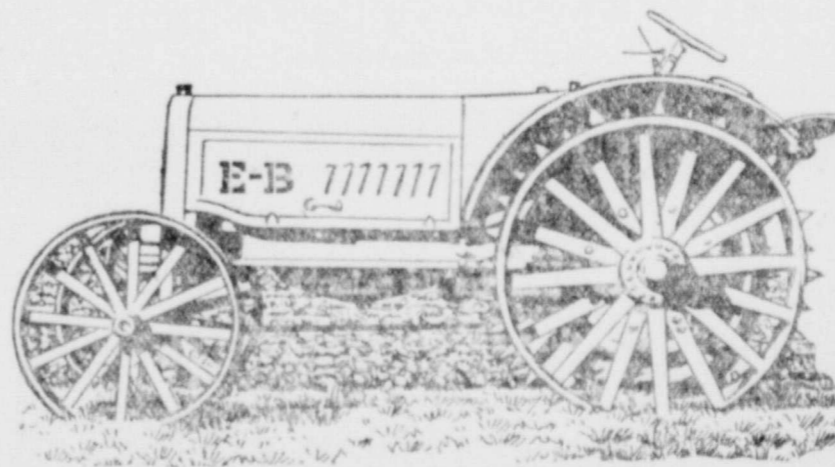
### NEIGHBOR CITIES AFTER SPEEDERS
