MEXICO CITY, Aug. 21.—President Carranza has requested the withdrawal of American forces from Mexico. In a statement to a United Press correspondent today the Mexican president said that the Mexican ambassador, Donillas, at Washington had been instructed to enter a protest against the American punitive expedition into Mexico and to immediately request the withdrrwal of the American troops.




