**Sugar Saving Chocolate
Cake a Family Favorite**

Mother will have fun watching the satisfied expressions all around the table when sugar-saving chocolate cake is the dessert, says the Country Cooking editor of nationally-circulated Capper's Farmer.

The secret of catching short sugar supplies is in using prepared pudding mixes in the baking job, whether it's thick-frosted cakes, hearty pies, cookies or nutbread, she tells home-maker readers of the magazine read by 1,300,000 farm families.

Chocolate Cake.

1 1/2 c. lard
2 egg, beaten
1/2 cup. sirup
1/2 cup. vanilla
1 c. milk

Have lard at room temperature; cream thoroughly, then add egg. Stir well and add sirup, milk and vanilla, blend. Sift dry ingredients together and stir into batter. Beat for



at least 2 minutes on low speed of electric mixer, or beat 200 strokes by hand. Cover bottoms of two 8-inch cake pans with waxed paper; grease lightly. Pour in batter. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) for 30 minutes or until done.

Chocolate Frosting.

1/2 cup. sweet chocolate
4 tbsp. cream
1/2 pk. chocolate pudding
1/2 tsp. vanilla

Melt chocolate in double boiler over hot water. Add 2 tbsp. cream and stir until smooth. Add pudding mix and stir until blended, adding remainder of cream as needed. Continue stirring over hot water until of spreading consistency, about 3 minutes. Add vanilla. Will frost one 10-inch loaf cake, or two 8-inch layers.

Cleanliness 'Must' in Making Baby's Formula

IMMACULATE cleanliness is necessary when preparing baby's formula for such care is important in keeping baby healthy, writes Georgia Leffingwell in an article in nationally-circulated Capper's Farmer.

"For efficiency and cleanliness, the utensils used in preparing baby's bottle should be kept together," she advises mothers. "They should not be used for any other purpose."



Utensils needed are: 8 to 10 eight-ounce bottles with rounded edges; bottle covers that can be sterilized; a dozen nipples; a funnel and a strainer; a bottle brush; tea spoons for scooping; for picking up formula; a sterilizer or kettle large enough to boil bottles, nipples and formula; a 32-ounce measuring formula; 2 wide-mouthed glass jars, one that can be sterilized for storing boiled nipples and covers and one for use for formula.

"Wash hands thoroughly before beginning formula preparation," the article cautions. "The whole 24 hours supply should be made up at one time, poured directly into the sterile bottles, and tightly capped."

All bottles, nipples and utensils should be washed inside and out with a clean bottle brush, using hot, soapy water. Place equipment in a sterilizer or large kettle and allow to boil at least 30 minutes. Then let them drain and cool. Fill the bottles, being careful not to overfill. Cover at once. Allow to cool a few minutes before placing in the refrigerator. When putting on nipple before a feeding, take care not to touch end that goes into baby's mouth.

Cleaning the Oven

Grease "baked on" in range ovens is hard to remove, the Rural Home editor of nationally-circulated Capper's Farmer points out. Scouring, unless done with care, may damage the enamel finish. So some economists with the U. S. Department of Agriculture suggest placing a shallow bowl of household ammonia or a wadded cloth dampened in ammonia — in the oven for several hours or overnight. Funnel help loosen greasy film; a saddy sopped oven may need several treatments.

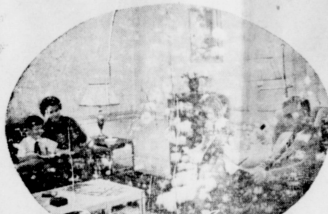

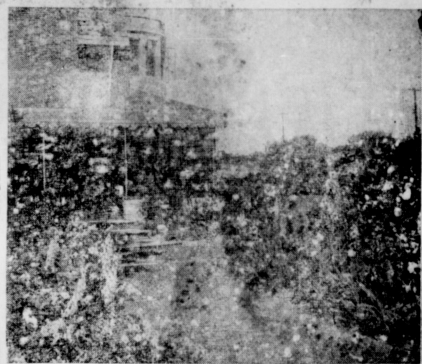

Grow Perennial Flowers From Seed

You can save considerable garden money and add new zest to your gardening by growing your own perennial flowers from seed. The best quality seeds cost only a few cents a packet and with simple care will produce scores of plants to bring color and beauty to the garden for years to come. Most perennials grown from seed bloom the second year after sowing.

Seed should be started at about the same time as that of the annuals, such as similes and marigolds. The secret of success is to get the seedlings to transplanting size early enough so that when set in their permanent places in garden or border, they will get a good root-hold before cold weather comes on.

A specially prepared seed bed or seed box is best for starting perennial seeds. A seed bed can be easily prepared by knocking the bottom out of a good-sized shallow wooden box and sinking the sides into the ground. The top should be about two or three inches above the surface. Use finely prepared, crumbly garden loam containing plenty of manure. It is important to level the seed bed where it will be sheltered from strong winds and from sunlight during the hottest part of the day.

A seed box or flat may also be used, with holes bored in the bottom for drainage. This has the advantage of being movable to sheltered locations when necessary.

Some perennial seeds are very small.

Mix them with sand, so that they will not be sown too thickly in the row and merely press them into the soil instead of covering them. Larger seeds need a shallow covering of soil. Firm the soil down on them so that they will make immediate contact with the moisture and plant food. Keep the soil moist but not wet until the seeds sprout. Some gardeners spread damp burlap over the surface to furnish needed moisture, removing it at the first sign of sprouting.

Here are a number of perennials that beginners can start from seed with almost sure success: Columbine, gaultheria, coreopsis, hollyhock, painted daisy, sweet william, hardy pink, hardy alyssum, and the violet.

Perennial seeds usually take somewhat longer to germinate than those of annual flowers. Don't be discouraged if the tiny sprouts do not show themselves for two or three weeks after the seed is sown.

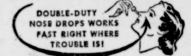

Improved Uniform SUNDAY International SCHOOL LESSON

JESUS LAYS DOWN HIS LIFE

LESSON TEXT—John 18:37, 38; 19:10-16, 28-30.

MEMORY SELECTION—For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.—John 3:16.

The cross of Calvary, from man's viewpoint, was "a paradox. There is something startling and seemingly incredible about the idea of a crucified king, particularly if those who do the crucifying are the king's own subjects. Kingship implies rulership over others, and not suffering and death at their hands. Pilate told the simple truth when he exclaimed, 'Behold your King,' and when he flung out the sarcastic question, 'Shall I crucify your King?' he was speaking more truly than he knew. They were, verily, doing the incredible thing of demanding the death of their King, their Messiah, yes, of the very Son of God" (B. L. Olmstead).

I. Jesus Said, "I Am a King" (18:37, 38).

Jesus was before Pilate. The Jews had accused him of declaring himself to be King (see Luke 23:2). Pilate demanded, "What king of the Jews?" (v. 33).

Jesus did not answer directly at first, but declared his kingdom to be "not of this world" (v. 36), indicating to Pilate that he was dealing with One who was more than an earthly king.

When Pilate persisted, Jesus openly declared, "I am a king." The expression "Thou sayest" (v. 37) carries the thought, "You say that I am a king and you are right. I am a king." It was in no sense a disavowal of his royalty, but a declaration of it.

Pilate, troubled, convinced of Christ's innocency but too cowardly to declare it, hid behind man's proverbial inability to know the truth (v. 40) and wrote, "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews."

What have we to say—what have you to say, dear reader, to Christ's claim to Kingship over your life? Should we not say, "He is not only King of the Jews, he is the King of my life!"

II. The Priests Said, "We Have No King" (19:15-16).

Pilate, in feebly pride, taunted Jesus with his power to determine his fate. He did have much power as the representative of Rome, but power over Jesus he did not have. Majestic indeed was the reply of the King. In a brief sentence Jesus put Pilate on trial before the judgment throne of God. Only because the time had come for the Son of God to die was Pilate permitted to exercise his governmental power (see Rom. 13:1), and he would answer for his decision one day in the presence of God.

Of special interest to us just now is the statement of Jesus: "He that delivered me unto thee hath the greater sin." It was the high priest, Caiaphas who had that guilt. "Yes, and you the high priests who declared, 'We have no king but Caesar,' after Pilate, driven by their cunning threat (v. 12), had sarcastically asked them, 'Shall I crucify your king?' (v. 19).

The awful declaration which they made then was on behalf of the entire nation, and declared themselves against Jesus and loyal to the pagan Caesar.

No King! Countless are the men and women today who by their rejection of Christ have declared that they would not have him rule over them. And sad but true is the fact that those who neglect to receive his great salvation have rejected him!

III. Jesus Said, "It Is Finished" (19:30).

In his time of greatest anguish Jesus, in an act of tender thoughtfulness, provided for his mother, and gave the beloved disciple, John, a high place of privilege and responsibility. He thus, as he made his last request, brought together the two who in all his human relationships had been closest to his heart.

Ready for the final word before he died, Jesus received the refreshment which quenched his awful thirst. Then crying out with a loud voice, "It is finished" (Matt. 27:50), he commended his soul into the hands of the Father (Luke 23:46).

What was finished? The great redemptive work, the work of reconciliation and atonement. The Lamb of God had made his great sacrifice for the world—it is this that was completed. Our great Substitute had

AROUND THE HOUSE

Cut worn out bath towels into rectangles to put under table place mats. The towel protects the table from hot dishes which may mar the surface, especially if the mat used is of a thin material.

For removing rust from steel or iron, a combination of steel wool and kerosene is good, although considerable elbow grease certainly will be necessary.

Rubber heel marks may be removed from linoleum with a cloth moistened with turpentine.

If the collar of a man's shirt is badly worn, cut it off with a razor blade and use it for a pattern in cutting a new collar from the tail of the shirt.

If a single stain has been exposed to the weather for three or four years it can be safely painted. Earlier than that, there is a chance it will become discolored.

Sweep up broken glass carefully and empty it into a tin can. Use a damp cloth or moist cotton to pick up the tiny slivers.

Planes Used to Maneuver Carriers in Place of Tugs

Aircraft carriers of the U. S. navy are maneuvered today in small areas by the propeller force of their own planes when tugs are not available.

For instance, if 10 planes are lined up facing starboard on one end of the flight deck and 10 are lined up facing port on the other end, all securely lashed, the propellers of each group, pulling in opposite directions, will turn the carrier completely around.
