Bolshevist Home Raided; Gary Under Martial Law

Two and Half Inch Rain Floods West Texas; Hail Falls In Places

Over two and a half inches of rain had fallen up to noon Tuesday, with the gauge steadily advancing toward three inches. After partly clearing off early Monday afternoon, another cloud blew up, and rain has been falling continually since.

The rain was general over Runnels, Concho, Taylor, Nolan, Coke and Tom Green counties, and a hailstorm swept over a part of Coke county, and some hail fell in the northwestern edge of Runnels county. No hail or wind was reported from any other section, and crops were damaged but little.

The rain that blew up late Monday afternoon prevented the circus from showing in Ballinger in the evening, and they loaded up early and left for Coleman. The picture shows and other business houses, though, did a good business on this account Monday evening.

The clouds began clearing off early after noon Tuesday, and the weather began to look favorable again. The weather forecast for tonight and Wednesday, though, predicts scattered showers.

According to the local cotton buyers, the rain is likely to lower the grade of cotton for some time. They stated, however, that if the farmers will give their cotton time to dry out, that the damage will be lessened. On the other hand, the farmers will take the first opportunity to get into the fields to pick the cotton, for fear that other rains will follow this one, and cotton be further damaged or lost.

While the farmers were sorry to see the rain, the cattle and sheep men are jubilant over the fact that grazing will be good next spring, and prevent the calamity that overtook them a year or two ago, when most of the live stock had to be shipped to other parts of the country.

TWO RAILROADS TIED UP BY RAINS

No trains have run on the Abilene and Southern road either Monday or Tuesday, on account of a washout in the tracks. The washout occurred near Iberis, a few miles south of Abilene. It has been impossible to get any mail through from that direction, and passenger service is being held up.

A number of farmers living near Winters are here with hands brought from South Texas, and are having to keep them here in Ballinger until passenger service can be restored on this road. The rains have made the roads impassable, and there is nothing for them to do but wait until trains begin operating again.

A washout on the Orient Railway was reported also. A bridge was washed away near Blackwell. This is the same bridge that was washed out last spring and tied up traffic on that road. Passengers it is understood, are being transferred instead of making detours with their trains over the Santa Fe tracks.

HAIL DESTROYS COTTON IN COKE

Robert Lee, Oct. 7.—A hailstorm that accompanied Sunday night and Monday's heavy rain wiped out the cotton crop of more than a half dozen farmers in the Graham Valley community just north and northwest of Robert Lee. In a strip ranging from a half-mile to a mile and from three to four miles long, the opening crop was completely destroyed and the stalks were beaten into the ground. In this area the hailstones missed some spots. Among the losers are M. E. Trimble, Robinson Brothers, Jim Cook, R. J. Allen, G. E. Davis, Jim Hux and County Judge D. I. Durham. Virtually all the fields wiped out would have made an average of a half-bale to the acre. The farmers were not needing rain and would have fared well without moisture for several weeks. From three to seven inches of rain fell throughout Coke county.

CINCINNATI CONFIDENT OF SERIES

REDLAND FIELD, Cincinnati, Oct. 7.—The weather at the opening of the sixth game of the world series was slightly cloudy this afternoon, but the grandstands and bleachers were packed to capacity.

The batteries will probably be as follows: Chicago, Kerr and Schalk; Cincinnati, Rueth and Rariden. The Reds expressed the fullest confidence that they will win the game today and end the series.

BAPTIST TRAINING SCHOOL POSTPONED

The Training School which was announced to begin tonight at the Baptist Church has been postponed to next Monday night on account of the bad weather. There will be three classes taught in Sunday School subjects, as follows: "The Seven Laws of Teaching," by Professor O. A. Fleming; "Talks With the Training Class," by Mrs. W. A. Bridwell, and "The Normal Manual," by Pastor Alvin Swindell. The classes will meet three times a week, for two weeks, beginning at 8:30 p. m. and closing at 9:10, at which time all classes gather in the auditorium for fifteen minutes during which the pastor will discuss Baptist doctrines. These courses will help anyone, whether teacher or not; and everybody in town or country is invited to come and get the benefit of the work.

The regular prayer service will be held Wednesday night.

GARY, Ind., Oct. 7.—Military authorities raided the alleged headquarters of anarchists and bolsheviks today, seeking to learn whether or not the United States Steel Company strike is being promoted from the home of bolshevism. Attorney Lacer of the strikers was among those arrested, which leads the officials to believe the nation-wide strike has been engineered by bolshevik agitators.

This action followed the arrival of four thousand federal troops, and a declaration that the city was placed under martial law, after rioting grew beyond the control of the city's authorities. Colonel Maps, who is commanding the federal forces, announced that all persons arrested will be subject to martial law.

CHICAGO, Oct. 7.—Clashes between strike sympathizers and the police and special deputies during the last forty-eight hours in the Chicago district did not deter heads of steel mills from attempting to start additional plants today, the beginning of the third week of the walkout. Company officials claimed they had assurance that large numbers of men who had been on strike for two weeks would return to work during the day and that many plants, which have been idle for two weeks would begin operations.

Union leaders increased their picket lines early today in an effort to prevent desertion and asserted that they looked for no material reduction in their ranks. John Fitzpatrick, chairman of the national committee conducting the strike, who planned to leave for Washington tonight to confer with heads of the American Federation of Labor said many members were being taken into the union every day.

The rioting by strike sympathizers in the Calumet district which includes Gary, Indiana Harbor, and East Chicago, Ind., and South Chicago, Ill., while being put under control by the police resulted in calling out twelve companies of Indiana National Guardsmen who today were prepared to suppress

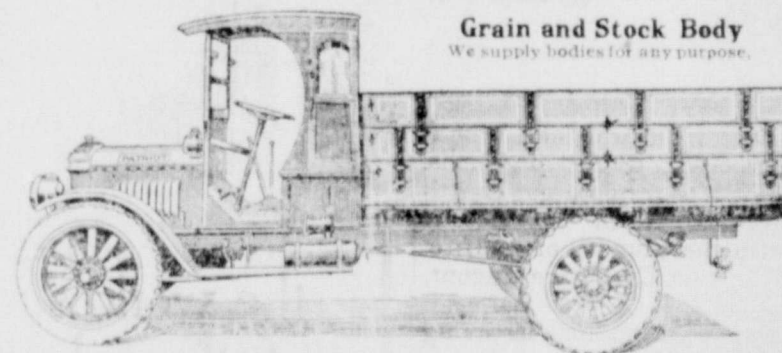

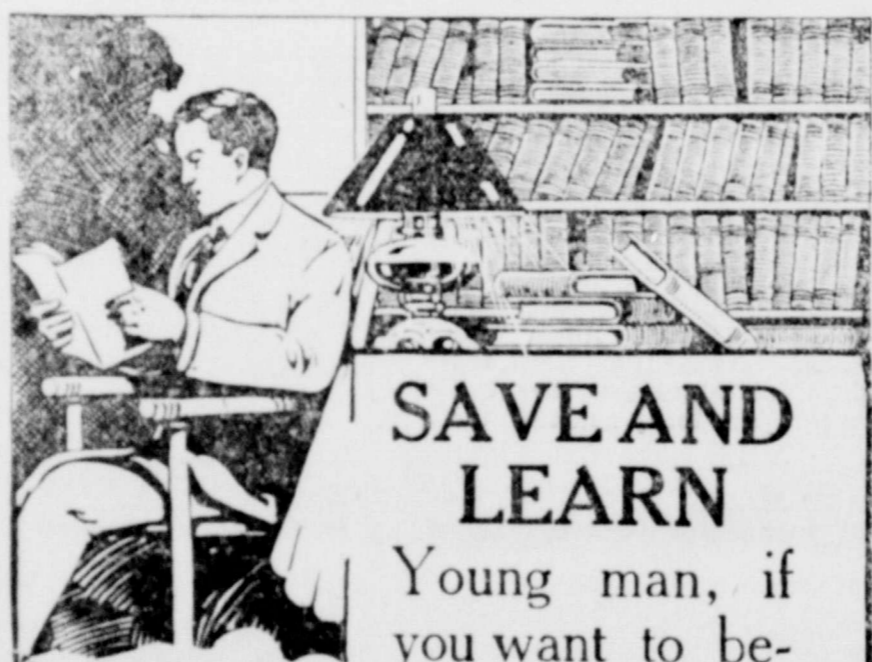
AUTOMOBILE HOUSE TO OPEN SOON

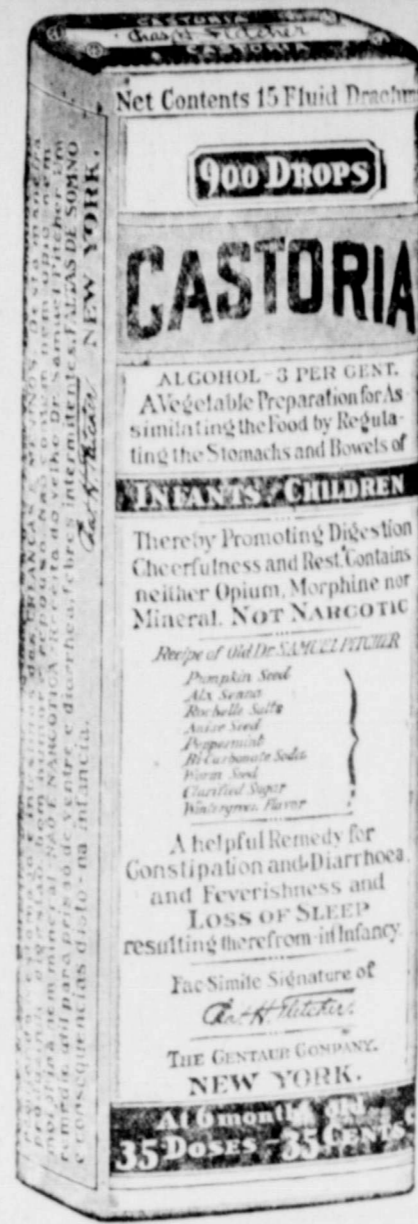

MANUFACTURING CENSUS STARTS ON JANUARY 2.

Washington, Oct. 7.—A statistical picture of manufacturing in the United States will be obtained by 1500 special agents of the Census Bureau, who will begin collection of information January 2, when the decennial population count is started.

The manufacturing census, however, is separate. The last one was made for 1914. It showed factories under normal conditions for seven months, after which the world war was in progress, and a temporary industrial depression occurred. The coming census, which will cover the year 1919, will show factories in the transition from a war to a peace time basis.

It is estimated it will find there are approximately 300,000 manufacturing plants, employing between 9,000,000 and 10,000,000 persons, and having an annual output valued at from 40 to 50 billions.

After 1920, manufacturing censuses are to be made biennially. They will show wages, costs, value and nature of output, and other detailed facts.

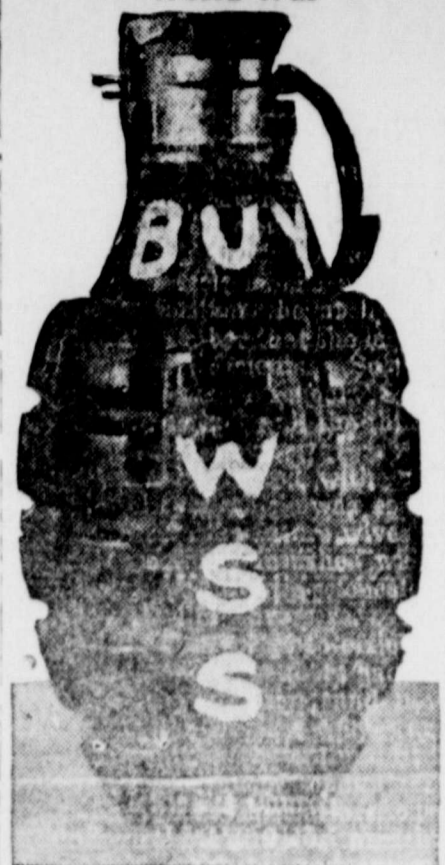

Got a Hand Grenade; Is Rarest Souvenir of Great World War



Hammering the Hun line until it bent and broke, bearing the Kaiser and his clans down to inglorious defeat, the American soldiers used one weapon in greater numbers than any other. It was a weapon they had never used before, one that had been obsolete for centuries—the hand-grenade—but when the brawny lads from the U. S. A. sent the old "eggs," as they were called, spinning into dugout and pill-box, the only Boches remaining on the ground were those ready to be buried.

Grenades were known to have been used five centuries ago. In 1427, at the siege of the Fortress of Casaglia on the River Po in Italy, the defenders used a primitive grenade, made of a glass bottle filled with powder. For a time, grenades were made out of heavy paper, then out of glass and then out of metal. With the close of the eighteenth century, the grenade began to be discarded and little use had been made of it until the Russo-Japanese war in 1904.

It remained for the Great World War to see the grenade developed into its present efficiency. The grenades used by the American doughboys were as carefully manufactured as their rifles. But the end of hostilities found a limited supply on hand and these were turned over to the Savings Division of the Treasury Department, the explosives extracted and they have been made over into savings banks.

Thus a weapon of war has been transformed into a "weapon of peace." Instead of being used to battle the Hun, it is now being used in the fight against the High Cost of Living and the arch-enemy, Thriftlessness. Any boy or girl can secure a grenade by purchasing a \$5 War Savings Stamp; any adult by investing in three or more War Savings Stamps, but these must have been bought after July 15, 1919. These hand grenades will be distributed through local banks and by a few merchants.

PECANS WORTH 15c PER POUND HERE

The report has gone out that the pecan market at Paint Rock is higher than in Ballinger, and many people are taking their pecans to Paint Rock rather than bring them here, but this report is untrue. As a matter of fact, buyers in Ballinger are paying one and a half cents, a pound higher for pecans here than in Paint Rock.

Last week a farmer who lives west of Ballinger brought some pecans here, and one buyer made him an offer of ten and a half cents a pound for them. He stated that he had already been selling them in Paint Rock for thirteen and a half cents, and finally sold them here for twelve and a half cents to this buyer. Another buyer who heard of the sale stated that he would gladly have paid fifteen cents for them, as pecans are scarce here at present, and stated that he wanted the people to know that the market is as good here as anywhere else, if not better. The buyer who is paying the lower price for pecans is helping himself for the present, but he is injuring the market here, and it will not be long before his own business will be ruined.

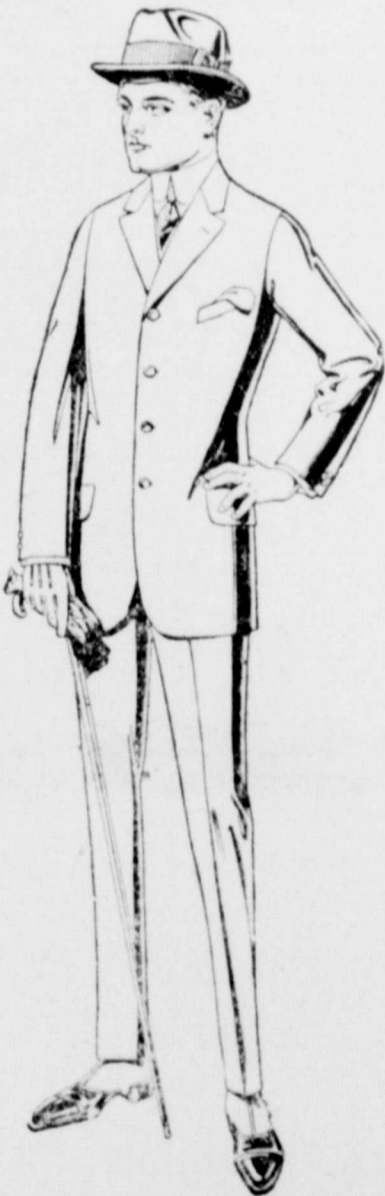
