Marketing Plans Are Made At W. G. A. Meeting

Carbon Watermelon Growers' Association had a most enthusiastic meeting on Monday night, March 3. Plans were made for the marketing of the large crop of melons and other farm produce that is expected from its membership this year.

John Wright, assistant to E. D. David, was the principal speaker. He congratulated the Carbon farmers on their foresight in this progressive and forward step. Mr. Wright explained that, this is not only a good plan for crop rotation, but also that, if and when we returned to marketing quotas on peanuts, the farmers of Carbon territory would already have a good substitute for the remaining land and a good market established for their products.

Mr. Wright brought out that Carbon territory was especially blessed by having fertile soil, abundant rainfall, and a good market, close at hand. He said that there was no reason why, if a slump comes in peanut production, the farmers of Carbon should not be ready to carry on in a profitable way, this progressive farm movement, marketing, not only watermelons but other produce which they can raise in great abundance, such as spuds, yams, peas, beans, popcorn and many others too numerous to mention.

New members are coming in the organization lately now and it is hoped that everyone will lend a hand in making Carbon the Garden Spot of Eastland County.

The association has its own debt-free produce shed and lot, and plans are under way to make improvements on the property in order to be ready for the summer crop. Any farmer, anywhere in Eastland County is welcome to join with the Carbon farmers. The membership fee is \$2.50 annually. Justified Increases Will Be In Checks For March

The Eastland Office of the State Department of Public Welfare has completed a desk review of all Old Age Assistance and Aid to the Needy Blind grants following action of the State Legislature in making more State money available for assistance. Mr. Lela C. Black, of the local office, announced today.

Adjustments are being made on all cases where increases are justified. The increases will be in checks for the month of March.

Mrs. Black pointed out that a blanket increase on all claims will not be made but that the standard food chart figures have been revised upward in accordance with the percentage of advance in food prices since the time of the last cost survey some two years ago. The number of persons in a family depending on the aid benefits will also be taken into consideration, Mrs. Black said.

Raises will range from \$1.00 to \$3.00 per month. The local office by working overtime last week was able to make adjustments on all claims. It, therefore, will not be necessary for individual recipients to have to come to the office.

The additional appropriation will allow money for payment of full claims in the Aid to Dependent Children program. Heretofore, due to limited funds, allocations were made to allow as much as there enough funds available to pay the full amount authorized, Mrs. Black said.

Ease Financing For New Homes

Remove some Controls Over Housing Industry; Drop Priority Plan.

WASHINGTON.—Liberized financing for builders of rental housing simultaneous with removal of FHA insured mortgages have been reduced. This had the effect of extending the average period of maturity for such mortgages from 27 years and 7 months on the basis of a 4 per cent interest rate.

The reduction was made by lowering the 2 per cent initial minimum principal payment to 1 1/2 per cent, with subsequent principal payments reduced accordingly.

FHA also announced that it had broadened eligibility standards for this type of mortgage insurance, permitting loans for elevator and corridor type apartment houses among other things.

To Protect Builders. The agency said too that it would provide a means for adjusting its insurance commitments to meet fluctuating construction costs and was studying means to protect builders against decreased earnings after the current housing shortings are relieved.

Revision of housing controls was announced earlier at a joint news conference by Federal Housing Executive Frank R. Creedon and National Housing Administrator Raymond H. Foley.

The old cost ceiling of \$10,000 on houses built for sale was removed. Also a requirement that plans and specifications be submitted to the federal housing administration for establishment of selling price, followed by government inspection to insure adherence to the plans was abolished.

Priorities no longer will be issued to home builders. Previous priorities however will be honored, but builders who use the priorities already issued must adhere to them, including the \$10,000 ceiling cost and the \$50 a month maximum rent.

The dwelling must be suitable and intended for year-round occupancy. The total floor area must not exceed 1,500 square feet, which officials said was sufficient for an ordinary three bedroom house. Equipping more than one bathroom is prohibited.

80 Average Rental. Rental properties must be submitted to FHA for establishment of a rent ceiling based on cost. Instead of the former flat ceiling of \$50 per month, the average for an entire project now is held at \$80 per unit, plus \$3 per room in service charges. Rental projects must be held 30 days for veterans.

Under the new program, non-veterans may obtain permits to build homes for their own occupancy and for construction under some other circumstances. Builders of dwellings for sale to veterans are required to hold them for veterans for 90 days after completion.

Builders may obtain permits to add rooms to house additional veterans or members of the applicant's family but the estimated construction cost may not exceed \$1,500 for each person additionally housed.

In addition, a veteran is eligible to make alterations or repairs on a dwelling up to \$10,000. Alterations and repairs of less than \$400 may be made without a federal permit.

In addition to the new housing actions, the government also junked distribution controls over penicillin; mandatory priorities for installation of telephone service; limitations on the use of tinplate; a prohibition against importation of cane spirits, and wholesale and retail inventory controls on a number of items of clothing.

Solves His Housing Problem; Must Get Goat, He Gets It

RIDGEWOOD, N. J.—If Harry Schefers and his family appear perplexed in solving their housing problem—blame it on a goat. Schefers, a war veteran seeking an apartment, was promised one by his landlord on condition that he owned a goat. The animal, she explained, was needed by her son, a college student, for experiments in bacteriology. Schefers obtained the animal. Now, however, the board of health threatens to intervene on the grounds that keeping the goat may be a violation of a city ordinance.

Industrial Defense For Future Urged

Nation's Vulnerability Prompts Plea for Action.

CHICAGO.—Total defense calls for total efforts on the part of the nation and American military authorities should devise a comprehensive program to avert a future catastrophe, Robert Wood Johnson declares in the magazine Army Ordnance. A retired brigadier general, Johnson served in the ordnance during World War II and also as vice chairman of war production board.

Aided by an expert military commission to furnish counsel, American industry should be entrusted with the task of protecting its production facilities through new construction or design, Johnson said. After formulation of a program, the help of labor should be enlisted in developing the projects.

Citing Gen. Carl Spaatz's recent statement that development of arctic routes in aviation have brought the threat of large-scale air bombardment to our inland cities as Pittsburgh, Chicago, Detroit and Minneapolis, Johnson demanded that military authorities reveal the type of industry plants and layout best calculated to withstand the shock of all-out air warfare.

Referring to the lessons taught in World War II, Johnson asked: Should new plants be dispersed, and if so, where? Which of these plants should go underground and why? To what extent and by what means should the armed services contribute to the obviously increased costs of such installations? Where is the authority to be centered?

Should we take advantage of land formations, such as small hills and valleys, which are or may not defend plants properly located against other direct hits?

Again citing Spaatz's assertion that the next war may find the enemy seeking out and vulnerable to America's great industrial plant in the first days of war, Johnson urged that military leaders and industrialists immediately begin to lay the groundwork for comprehensive defense. He deplored previous unpreparedness, resulting in all-out production of cost to meet pressing demands.

In Sweden the underground factories were built at a cost only 15 per cent higher than for surface structures, Johnson said.

Time Lost in Strikes In '46 Breaks Records WASHINGTON.—Time lost by strikes in the first 11 months of 1946 topped all records, including the strike-torn postwar year of 1919, the bureau of labor statistics reported.

A total of 17,475,000 man days (a day's work for one man) were lost by work stoppages between January and November, three and a half times the strike idleness in the same period of 1945 and nearly 14 times that of the first 11 months of the war year, 1944.

United States Army and Navy Join in Battle Against Vice

WASHINGTON.—The army and navy have joined in an anti-vice drive to combat prostitution, venereal disease and other "conditions inimical to the morals and welfare of service personnel." War Secretary Patterson and Navy Secretary Forrestal signed an order setting up the central joint army-navy disciplinary control board. Joint army-navy disciplinary boards are being set up in every army and navy district.

The local army-navy disciplinary boards will inform themselves on conditions in their areas relating to prostitution, venereal disease, liquor violations, disorders and other undesirable conditions. The boards will recommend suitable action to the naval district or army area commanders.

Cape Cod Tower Honors Jenny Lind, Famous Swedish Diva

TRURO, MASS.—A Cape Cod landmark is the Jenny Lind tower. In 1850, the famous Swedish singer gave two concerts in Boston's Faneuil Hall. The hall was in Fitchburg terminal and when that station was razed in 1927, one of its four stone towers was brought to Cape Cod and erected as a lasting memorial to Jenny Lind.

Liquid Helium Cuts Capers At Extreme Temperatures

The strangest of all the unique properties of liquid helium was discovered recently at the Institute of Physical Problems in Moscow, says Collier's. In the experiment, two bowls of the liquid were prepared, with the contents of one at a temperature within one degree centigrade of absolute zero, the point where it loses all viscosity, and the contents of the other at a temperature about two degrees higher where it still retains some viscosity.

When the bowls were connected by a glass tube, their contents began to flow from one to the other, both liquids using the full capacity of the tube simultaneously.

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JESUS WASHES THE DISCIPLES' FEET

MEMORY SELECTION—A new commandment I give unto you, that ye love one another, as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.—John 13:34.

On the eve of his crucifixion our Lord gave to his followers a striking example of how true humility should be practiced.

Almost in the shadow of the cross the disciples had fallen into an argument about which of them should be greatest. Christ showed them the way of true greatness by an act of menial service, giving them an example for their own lives, a pattern of love.

He who was about to wash his disciples feet was fully conscious who he was, whence he came, what his power was, and where he was going.

Verse 3 gives us a clear view of our Lord's knowledge of himself as divine, sent by the Father and to return to him. He was conscious that he was King of kings and Lord of lords—all things had been put into his hands.

He knew that real greatness proves itself in the ability to stoop if need be to minister to the humblest. It was just like Jesus to take the place of the servant. It is just like him to do the loving, thoughtful, compassionate thing for us today.

Peter's impulsive refusal to be washed enabled the Lord to teach him, and us, a needed lesson. The one who had come clean and well-groomed to the feast needed only to have the dust of the road cleaned from his sandaled feet.

Just so the one who has been cleansed from his sins by the blood of Christ returns daily for the cleansing of the sinners and soil of the journey through this wicked world. We must remember that this constant cleansing (1 John 1:7) is necessary. It is not enough to make a decision for Christ and receive salvation; we need his daily grace for daily living.

When he resumed his place at the table, Jesus faced a humbled and ashamed group of men ready to have driven home to their hearts the powerful meaning of the example which had been set before them.

They called him Lord and Master, and he agreed that they were right. Now he had set them a pattern of lowly service. They had already seen the rebuke involved, so he stressed only the positive side, the need for them to do what he had done.

It is one thing to understand what has been taught, it is another thing to put it into practice. Jesus conditioned his blessing on the doing, rather than the hearing (see vv. 16, 17).

We are told in James 1:22 that the one who is a hearer of the Word and not a doer of it is self-deceived. He is fooling himself about his supposed spiritual progress. God is not deceived by it, and usually his fellow men are not deceived by his profession of what he does not have. How sad then to go on deceiving himself and how foolish!

It is really not a matter of choice for the believer whether he will live in the light of this great example—it is a commandment of God. Oh, yes, it is a commandment of love, but that makes it not less but more binding on who believe in Christ.

By act and example he set before his disciples the great and new commandment of love, expressing it in loving service.

The measure of our love for our brethren is the love of Christ Jesus. That love, we all agree, was without limit, unconditionally great, inex-pressibly tender, infinite in its purpose and power.

We cannot measure up to it. What then do we do? Surely we must give to our very limit and beyond that limit by God's grace, of our love for one another. Nothing less will do, if we are to keep his commandment.

Such love between Christian brethren has always been the most effective kind of testimony for Christ. As men see true and sacrificial love shown between Christians, they are drawn to Christ and the church.

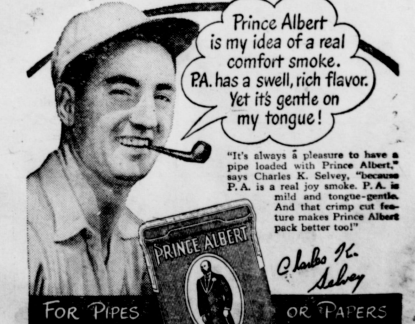
