EASY MONEY FOR THE LABOR AGENT

The demand for cotton pickers here offered opportunities for the crooks to get in their work, and it appears that one farmer near Ballinger is out one hundred dollars on a smooth scheme worked by a man in Trinity county.

Early in October Sheriff Perkins received a letter addressed to the sheriff of Runnels County, Ballinger, Texas, and signed by "Jimmie Forrest," in which the writer of the letter stated that he could send a family of cotton pickers here who would pick from 1800 to 2,000 pounds of cotton per day.

The letter was dated at Helms, Trinity county. "Forrest" stated that the family would come if the money for transportation was advanced.

Mr. Perkins made known this good luck for some farmer, and Dean Brothers put up the money and had a local bank wire the cash to the bank at Groveton, Texas, and notified "Forrest" to get the money and send the hands at once.

After waiting for a reasonable length of time for the cotton pickers, and failing to hear from them, Dean Brothers started an investigation, and the authorities are now working on the case.

The bank at Groveton delivered the money to a man giving his name as Forrest, but since that time Forrest has not been heard from, and his whereabouts are unknown. The officers are of the opinion that there is no such man as "Jimmie Forrest," and that the man working the scheme used a fictitious name.

PROMINENT SPEAKERS VISITING INSTITUTE

Thursday was the big day at the Ballinger-San Angelo Teachers' Institute, which is in progress in this city.

BIG JUMP IN SEED MARKET

Jumping from about fifty dollars per ton to seventy-five dollars per ton in the local cotton seed market overnight, is some jump. Seed were selling on the local market for around fifty dollars Wednesday, Thursday morning street buyers were paying seventy-five dollars per ton.

No explanation could be given for the big jump.

Seed a few days ago were selling for \$74 on the streets and \$70 at the gins. A drop came and seed went down to fifty dollars, and are now higher than the highest price, Jim Flynt buying on the streets and paying \$75.

Quite a number of farmers are refusing the \$75 price, claiming that they expect to sell their best seed for twice that amount of money at planting season.

MAY RECEIVE 20,000 BALES

The street in front of The Ledger office was congested for an hour or two Thursday morning and cotton wagons were so thick that autos had to thread their way down the street.

There were a few trucks loaded with cotton, and we counted thirty-odd bales of cotton on the street at one time, notwithstanding that the stuff was bringing forty cents per pound, causing it to move fast, and wagons to stop only long enough for a buyer to rip the bagging and give the farmer a ticket.

Gins are running on full time, and some all night, yet they are far behind with the ginning. Wagons line up and wait for hours to get to their turn at the gin.

A report from the four local gins Wednesday night shows that almost four thousand bales of cotton have been ginned here, and it is estimated that about one-third of the crop in this territory is out.

Cotton men differ in their estimate as to what the total receipts at the local yard will run this season. The estimate runs from fifteen to twenty thousand, while the estimate on the county production runs as high as forty thousand.

MAY ORDER LEADERS TO END STRIKE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 6.—The coal mine strikers will be charged with conspiracy against the government under the food and fuel act, if Assistant Attorney General Ames has his way.

Attorney Ames left Washington this afternoon for Indianapolis, where the issuance of the court commanding the miners' officials to withdraw the strike order will be asked before Judge Anderson.

Mr. Ames will argue the conspiracy act, and if the court orders the strike order withdrawn, steps will be taken immediately to enforce the court's order.

There were no new developments in the situation today, further than a general feeling that the strike is weakening as shown by statements from the mine union leaders that the strike might be ended if the injunction proceedings were withdrawn. The government will not withdraw the court order.

PECAN GATHERING IS GOING BEGGING

The drop in the pecan market and the scarcity of labor is responsible for a drag in pecan gathering.

Heretofore owners of pecan orchards had no trouble in contracting with parties to gather them on halves, but this year pecan gatherers can make more money picking cotton than they can gathering pecans on halves.

The pecan crop is the best this country has produced in many years. The nuts are unusually large, well matured and of a rich flavor.

Along the banks of the Colorado river large trees with heavily loaded branches extend out over the water, and the nuts are falling in the water and going to waste.

Pecan gatherers usually save the pecans which fall in the water by using a boat and arranging a drift under the branches which are over the water, and when the nuts are thrashed off they float up against the drift and are easily gathered.

The pecan price is not what it should be, considering the high price of everything else. In fact, the delicious nuts are selling below the usual price, the average run of pecans bringing from ten to fifteen cents per pound.
